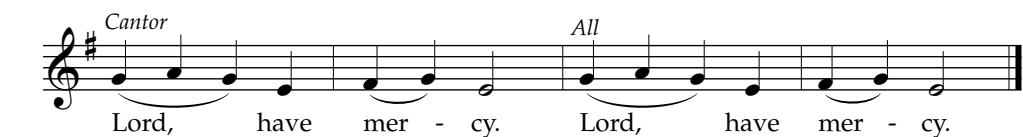
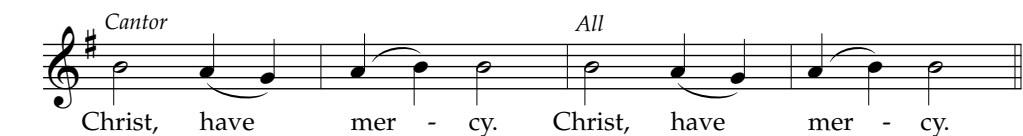

The burning sands will become pools, and the thirsty ground, springs of water.

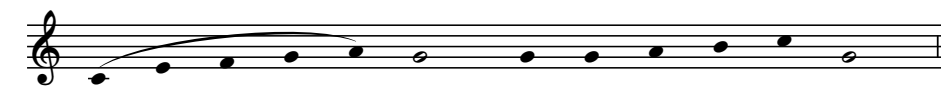
