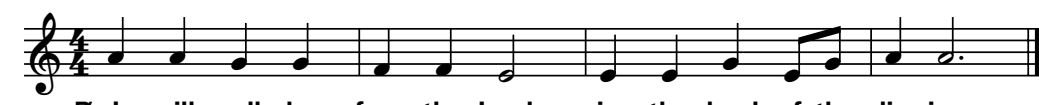

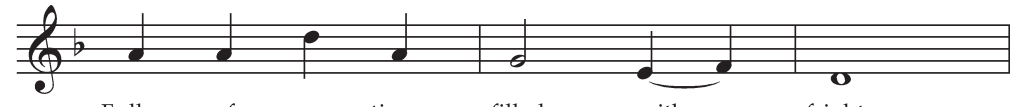

First and last and only one. Let creation now adore him! Kyrie eleison.

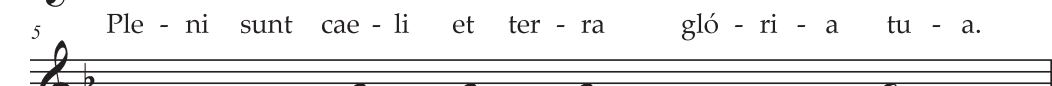
