

Dear Parishioners,

Yesterday, February 11, 2017, we observed the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes and the World Day of the Sick, as mentioned in last Sunday's Parish Bulletin. Thousands of pilgrims visit the shrine at Lourdes each year asking the prayers of Mary for the sick. Twenty-five years ago, Pope Saint John Paul II, established the observance of the World Day of the Sick as a special time of reminding everyone to see in the sick the very face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising achieved our salvation (see 1992 Letter of Institution). In a real way, the sick bear the cross of Christ as their sickness burdens and weakens them. In the cross of Christ, the sick find comfort and hope. We pray for the sick every Sunday in the Universal Prayer at Mass and commend to the prayers of all who read our Parish Bulletin sick family members and friends. Christ, as you know, has given to the Church a sacrament for the sick. This Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is especially for those who are seriously ill, facing surgery, and impeded by the difficulties associated with aging. Often times, as priests, we are called to administer this Sacrament when emergencies arise, especially in our neighboring hospitals. The Sacraments to receive at the end of life include Penance, the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Viaticum. Holy Viaticum is our last participation in Holy Communion as our passage is made from earth to eternal life. The Sacrament of the Sick, however, is for the sick even when there is no danger of death. I encourage you to receive this Sacrament if you are seriously ill or going to the hospital for surgery or if the senior years are a real struggle for you. *To receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please notify the Parish Office or see one of the priests after Sunday Mass. The Sacrament can be received at any time and almost in any place. Christ wants to heal us and be our strength, especially with his Sacraments.*

*This year again we are planning three Religious Enrichment Sessions for parish school age candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. These will take place on Sundays in the Neumann Room. The first session for Confirmation will be on Sunday, February 26, 2017 and for First Holy Communion will be on Sunday, March 26, 2017. All our parish school age candidates for these Sacraments are expected to participate. For more information, please contact Patricia Smith, our Coordinator of Religious Education at the Parish Office. Also, if you have child who is not in any formal program of religious education and is of the proper age for the Sacraments, please contact the Parish Office as well.*

The second collection at Mass next Sunday *will be for the winter maintenance needs of the Cathedral Basilica.* Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish in so many ways and to the annual Catholic Charities Appeal.

## LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD

### Sin dinero no hay misión

Ocasionalmente los católicos preguntan: “¿Por qué la Iglesia siempre está hablando de dinero?” Tal vez piensen que la Iglesia es rica y que no necesita el apoyo económico de cada uno de los católicos. Si la Iglesia recibiera subvenciones del gobierno o dinero del Vaticano, eso sería cierto. Gracias a la separación entre Iglesia y gobierno, la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos puede gobernarse sin la interferencia de las autoridades civiles. Pero somos nosotros la fuente principal de fondos que tiene la Iglesia para llevar a cabo todos sus ministerios. Todos podemos dar, aunque no todos podamos dar lo mismo. Nuestro llamado incluye el apoyo económico a la Iglesia de tres maneras. La primera es el compromiso que hacemos con Dios para apoyar a nuestra parroquia con nuestra ofrenda semanal. El párroco y el consejo de finanzas deben cubrir todos los gastos de la parroquia con la colecta de cada semana. El dinero que ponemos en las cestas hace posible que podamos servir y ser servidos tal como nos pide Cristo. La segunda manera es hacer una donación o promesa financiera a nuestra diócesis para que se puedan costear los ministerios y programas que son demasiado costosos o complicados para que una parroquia pueda ofrecerlos por sí sola. Mientras más ayudemos a nuestra diócesis, más nos aseguramos de que la Iglesia pueda entrenar a futuros sacerdotes, proporcionar educación en la fe, servicios sociales, y servicios para los matrimonios y de índole familiar—sólo por mencionar algunos. La tercera manera en que podemos ayudar es a través de lo que decidamos contribuir en las segundas colectas, lo cual beneficia las diferentes obras de nuestra parroquia, nuestra diócesis y más allá de ellas. Éstas son obras que la Iglesia considera dignas de nuestro apoyo. Nosotros decidimos cuáles queremos apoyar y con qué cantidad nos es posible hacerlo. Nosotros, como Cuerpo de Cristo, podemos hacer nuestra misión sólo en la medida en que haya dinero para proveer las necesidades. Por el amor de Dios, hagamos nuestra parte.

### La Corresponsabilidad Vivida Ahora

Según la Biblia, lo ideal que podemos ofrecer a Dios de lo que primero nos ha dado es el diezmo (10 por ciento), lo cual en nuestros días se sugiere que la mitad sea para la parroquia y diócesis, y la otra mitad se destine a nuestras obras de caridad preferidas. Si esa cantidad no te es posible debido, por ejemplo, a estar desempleado o a tener una entrada baja, piensa en una cantidad razonable para ti y trata de ofrecerla regularmente.

## LIVING STEWARDSHIP NOW

### *No Money, No Mission*

Occasionally Catholics ask, "Why is the Church always talking about money?" They may think that the Church is wealthy and can do without the financial support of individual Catholics. If the Church were supported by government grants or special funds from the Vatican that might be true. Thanks to the separation of church and state, the Church in the United States is able to govern itself without interference from secular authorities. So the principal source of funding for the Church to perform all its ministries must be all of us. Everyone can give, though not all can give the same amount. We are called to support the Church financially in three ways. The first is with our commitment to God to support our local parish through our weekly offerings. Based upon the weekly collection, the pastor and finance council must cover all parish expenses. Our money in the collection basket ensures that we can serve and be served as Christ calls us. The second way is a donation or pledge to our diocese to fund ministries and programs that are too costly or complicated for any single parish to provide. The more we support our diocese, the more we ensure that the Church can train future priests and provide education, social services, and marriage and family services—to name but a few. The third way is through gifts that we choose to give to second collections, which benefit various causes in our parish, our diocese, or beyond. These are causes that the Church says are worthy of our support. We decide which ones we wish to support and with what amount as we are able. We, as the Body of Christ, can only fulfill our mission if there is money to pay the way. Let's all do our part, for the love of God.

### *Living Stewardship Now*

The biblical ideal of giving money back to God is the tithe (10 percent), of which we now suggest that half go to your parish and local diocese and the rest to your favorite charities. If this amount seems impossible because, for example, you are unemployed or on a small fixed income, set an amount that works for you and try to give it regularly.
