Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow, January 22, 2018, is the 45th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, Roe vs. Wade, which legalized abortion in the United States. Since 2011 at the direction of the American Bishops, Catholics in the United States have observed January 22 as a day of prayer and penance. The intention of our prayer is the full restoration and legal guarantee of the right to life. Our penance is for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. Decide today that you will pray for this intention tomorrow, and what your personal sacrifice will be as well. Consider coming to the 7:15 AM or the 12:05 PM Mass in the Cathedral Chapel as part of your prayer for this day. The Holy Rosary will be prayed twenty minutes before both Masses tomorrow for the intention for the protection of human life.

We are in the midst of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This Week of Prayer began on Thursday, January 18th and will conclude this Thursday, January 25th, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle. Jesus prayed at the Last Supper that all his followers would be one, with Him and with each other. Circumstances of history have brought great division to the Church and, although united in Christ and His Church through Baptism, these divisions among Christians continue into our day. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity gives us the focused opportunity to pray for unity of Christians. Please bring this intention to your personal prayer, especially during your prayers at Mass.

The Basilica and the Chapel are open to the homeless yearround. Our only rule is that they sit up in the pew and every hour get up and move around. This is to prevent someone from setting up camp in one of the pews. Our location in Center City makes our Basilica and Chapel an inviting location for the homeless, providing a warm place when it is cold outside, and likewise a cool place when it is hot. We cooperate with a variety of agencies to provide for the homeless when they are willing and we also do our part in taking care of many of these men and women. At times, though, there is unacceptable behavior, including panhandling, stealing and vandalism. If you see anything like this taking place, please report it immediately to one of the sacristans, a member of the maintenance staff, a Cathedral Ambassador/Greeter or one of the parish priests, who can then report it to the proper authorities. Unfortunately, we continue to see an increase in this unacceptable behavior. The homeless are always welcome and we have a duty to care for them. At the same time, we have a duty to protect people and property from harm.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to winter maintenance expenses of the Cathedral Parish. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish in so many ways.

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ON THE VALUE OF TIME

What respect ought we not to have, then for the time which is given to us! We ought to value it as much as, nay more than if it were a diamond which would buy a kingdom. For what is an earthly kingdom compared with the kingdom of heaven?

"Time is as precious as heaven," says St. Bernard; and nothing is more true, because not only, no one will attain heaven without having passed through the trials of time, but he will only obtain it, according to the divine promises, as the reward of a good use of time. This eternal reward can depend upon a single moment well employed. Witness the good thief: his life had been a bad one; he was certainly on the point of death; but in that awful moment, enlightened by grace, he humbly recognized his sins, he implored mercy from our Divine Redeemer; immediately heaven was promised to him, and Jesus said to him, "This day thou shalt be with Me in Paradise."

"Time is as precious as the Blood of Jesus Christ," adds St. Bernard, because ... redemption has been wrought only at the price of the Blood of Jesus Christ; it is (the shedding of) His Blood (in time) which has made time fruitful. How avaricious ought we then to be of time, and how should we fear to lose one moment of it! For even God is avaricious of it. He bestow His gifts and graces on us in torrents, but time He gives us only drop by drop; no one ever received two instants of it at once. And how people do waste this precious time! They spend it on trifles, they study how to get rid of it, they use it to offend God and to bring eternal misery.

Time is worth as much as God Himself: and behold why and how, continues the holy doctor, by every instant well employed we can win the eternal possession of God. Therefore what a severe account will one day be demanded of us! One moment is sufficient to utter an idle word; and Jesus Christ assures us that this loss of time, insignificant as we think it, will not pass unnoticed: "I say unto you, that every idle word that men shall speak, they shall render an account for it on the Day of Judgement" Matt. 12:16 (Source: www.institute-christ-king.org/uploads/westorange/bulletins)

Someone has suggested that if Jesus were to send his twelve disciples for psychological testing today he might receive this reply: "Thank you for submitting the résumés of the twelve men you have picked for managerial positions in your new organization. All of them have taken our complete battery of tests. In addition, we arranged personality interviews for each of your candidates with our psychologists and vocational aptitude consultants. It is the opinion of our staff that most of your nominees are lacking in the background, education, and skills necessary for the success of your enterprise. None of them shows an understanding of the team concept. Simon Peter is impulsive and would benefit from angermanagement counseling. Andrew has no measureable leadership qualities. The two brothers, James and John, place personal ambition above company loyalty. Thomas shows a skeptical attitude that would tend to undermine morale. In his previous business, Matthew was blacklisted by the Jerusalem Better Business Bureau. James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus definitely have radical political leanings, and appear to have unstable temperaments. One of the candidates, however, shows real potential. He is a man of ability and resourcefulness, possesses excellent social skills, and has contacts in high places. He is highly motivated, ambitious, and responsible. We recommend Judas Iscariot as your comptroller and righthand man." Today Jesus calls us. Like Peter, we lack faith. Like Andrew, we have much to learn. Like James and John, we are selfish. Like Matthew, we have a past. Like Thomas, we sometimes doubt. If Jesus could use them, he can certainly use us. With God's help, we too can grow from strength to strength and accomplish great things for God and the Kingdom. The call to follow Jesus is urgent. Answer now.
