Dear Parishioners.

Lent turns a corner this Sunday. This is the Fifth Sunday of Lent! These last days of Lent focus more on the passion of our Lord Jesus Christ and the great price that he paid with his death for our redemption and salvation. The prayers of the Church and the biblical readings for Mass during this time draw us more deeply into the passion of the Lord to lead us into a more profound participation in the Sacred Paschal Triduum. I encourage you to join us for daily Mass and also to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation during this last period of Lent. Additionally, I suggest that you read the Passion of the Lord from one of the Gospels at home and to reflect quietly on it. Perhaps, you might spend some time there in prayer before the crucifix and recite this traditional prayer:

Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus while before Your face I humbly kneel and, with burning soul, pray and beseech You to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope, and charity; true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment.

While I contemplate, with great love and tender pity, Your five most precious wounds, pondering over them within me and calling to mind the words which David, Your prophet, said to You, my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet, they have numbered all My bones." Amen.

This Monday, March 19, 2018, is the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Solemnities of Lent, Saint Joseph Day and the Annunciation (March 25), displace the Lenten penance to celebrate these days with a certain festivity. Consider coming to Mass at 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM to honor great Saint Joseph on his feast. We turn to Saint Joseph to pray for the Church and for each of us to have the blessing of a happy death. Since the Solemnity of the Annunciation this year falls on Palm Sunday, it will be observed on Monday, April 9, the first free liturgical day after the Octave of Easter.

Basilica Spring Cleaning takes place this week. Everyone is welcome to help at any of the times listed below. If possible, please join us and bring a bucket and some rags with you.

Jesus was killed. This is one of those facts that everybody knows, but whose significance is often overlooked. He didn't simply die; he was executed. We as Christians participate in the only major religious tradition whose founder was executed by established authority. And if we ask the historical question, "Why was he killed?" the historical answer is because he was a social prophet and movement initiator, a passionate advocate of God's justice, and radical critic of the domination system who had attracted a following. If Jesus had been only a mystic, healer and wisdom teacher, he almost certainly would not have been executed. Rather, he was killed because of his politics —because of this passion for God's justice.
