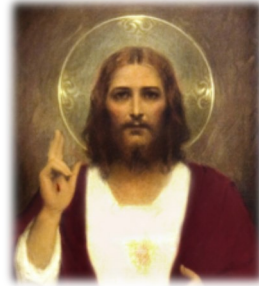

Dear Parishioners,

The Holy Gospel for this Sunday reminds us that Jesus is truly present to us when the Gospel is proclaimed at Mass. “Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing (Luke 4: 21).” Our lives are filled with all kinds of noise and all sorts of words filling our ears. Yet, there is only one Word that saves and redeems us. This is the living Word of God, the Divine Word, Jesus himself, the Word become flesh. This is the Word announced in the Gospel at every Mass, Jesus himself speaking his own Gospel to us. When the Gospel is proclaimed we are on our feet. However, are we truly attentive as the Lord himself speaks to us? Do we recognize the power of this Word to change our hearts and make us new? Are we resolved to keep the Word we hear and live it? The lesson of this Sunday’s Gospel gives us the opportunity to profess our faith in the holy Word of God and to renew our fidelity to it.

This Saturday, February 2, 2019, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we observe the World Day of Consecrated Life. This is a day to thank God and pray for those consecrated to the Lord with the vows of chastity, poverty and obedience. We are especially grateful to have Sister Eleanor McCann, RSM, Sister Mary Luchia, PVMI, and Father Isaac Haywiser, OSB, as members of the Consecrated Life serving in our Cathedral Parish. There will be a Holy Hour at 11:00 AM followed by the 12:05 PM Mass to pray for all those in the Consecrated Life on February 2. The blessing of candles will take place at Mass. All are welcome.

On Saturday and Sunday, February 2 and 3, 2019, we are privileged to have the Relic of the incorrupt heart of Saint John Vianney with us through the goodness of the Knights of Columbus. Next Sunday, February 3, 2019, is also the Memorial of Saint Blaise and the occasion for the Blessing of Throats. There will be a general blessing of throats at each Mass and also the opportunity for the personal blessing of throats following each Mass.

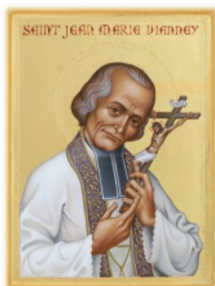

Hace unos cuantos años una parroquia ofreció un día de reflexión para mujeres. A todas las participantes se les pidió que hicieran una lista de los talentos que creían Dios les había dado. Muchas de ellas parecían haberse estancado en ese momento. Unas se quedaron mirando vagamente por una ventana, otras masticaban su lápiz y unas pocas escribieron algo y enseguida después lo tachaban. Una mujer susurró: “Esto es muy difícil. Pudiera haber escrito mucho más si me hubieran pedido que apuntara mis faltas y fracasos”. Por fin se acabó el tiempo y la facilitadora pidió que compartieran lo que habían escrito. Miró alrededor de la sala y le pidió a alguien que empezara. Aunque a regañadientes, Rosa se paró. Muchas personas allí la conocían bien. Ella estaba muy involucrada en diferentes servicios en la comunidad; estudiaba las Escrituras con otros parroquianos, pertenecía a un grupo de oración, ayudaba a organizar retiros anuales de la parroquia y estaba a cargo de una despensa de alimentos de la localidad. En esta oportunidad dijo así: “Tuve que pensar esto mucho. No pude hacer una lista porque no me creo tan especial. Pero sí sé que mi familia dice que soy una persona muy dulce”. Enseguida se escucharon unos respiros entrecortados, pues todas se asombraron de oír que esta gran mujer no podía ver sus propios dones. Muchos de nosotros nunca nos hemos detenido a pensar cuáles son nuestros verdaderos talentos. Por un lado podemos pensar que sabemos cuáles son, pero por otro lado creemos que reconocerlos es demostrar un orgullo indebido. Cualquiera de estos dos enfoques podría retrasarnos en realizar plenamente lo que se espera de nosotros. Sin embargo, reconocer nuestra capacidad y las habilidades con las que Dios nos ha bendecido es parte de la vida adulta de fe; y usar esos dones para construir el reino de Dios aquí en la tierra es responder con gratitud.

**SAINT JOHN VIANNEY'S INCORRUPT HEART:
A FIRST-CLASS RELIC**

Within the tradition of the Catholic Church, one of the more interesting elements, especially in our current times, is the reality of relics, both from the life of our Lord and of the Saints. Relics are part of the category of sacramentals as holy items which we venerate. Sacramentals "are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments. They signify effects, particularly of a spiritual nature, which are obtained through the intercession of the Church. By them men are disposed to receive the chief effect of the sacraments, and various occasions in life are rendered holy." (CCC #1667) The veneration of relics, as a sacramental act, points us to the reality of the Saints and reminds us to pray to them for their intercession. Relics give us a physical connection with heaven itself:

Relics are physical objects that have a direct association with the saints or with Our Lord. They are usually broken down into three classes: First class relics are the body or fragments of the body of a saint, such as pieces of bone or flesh. Second class relics are something that a saint personally owned, such as a shirt or book (or fragments of those items). Third class relics are those items that a saint touched or that have been touched to a first, second, or another third class relic of a saint.¹

As those items which help us to connect to the saints, relics have been known to communicate God's healing power through the intercession of the particular saint. The notion of relics has a Scriptural basis in that Elisha kept the cloak of Elijah when he went up to heaven (2 Kings 2:9-14) and items that St. Paul touched conducted God's healing powers to the sick, infirm and those possessed by evil (Acts 19:11-12). Saint John Vianney's incorrupt heart classifies as a first-class relic and we have the opportunity to venerate, give honor to God, for this heart, which reminds us of God's love for each one of us.

St. John's heart burned with the love of God and he was renowned for his holiness as a parish priest. God, recognizing this love, did not allow St. John's heart to decay. We have the opportunity to venerate and pray to this saint as we gaze upon a physical reminder that he wants to take our prayers to God. A petition that we can pray for as we venerate this heart is for all parish priests since St. John is the patron of parish priests.

So, when you have an opportunity to venerate this relic, think about the priests you have known and those you do not know, especially those who are struggling to be good holy priests. Pray that all priests will be holy. Pray for more men to become priests and that those priests would come from your families.

KNOWING YOUR GIFTS

A few years ago, a parish held a Women's Day of Reflection. Each participant was asked to compile a list of what they perceived as their God-given talents. Many seemed to get stuck at this point. Some gazed out of the window, others chewed on their pencils, and a few wrote things down and then vigorously crossed them out. One woman whispered, "This is so difficult. I could have written much more if I'd been asked about my faults and failings." Finally time was up, and the facilitator asked everyone to share what they had written. She looked around the room and asked someone to start things off. Rather reluctantly, Kerrin stood up. Many people there knew her well. She was deeply involved in service to others throughout the community. She studied scripture with other parishioners, she belonged to a prayer group, she helped organize annual parish retreats, and she ran a local food pantry. She said, "I really had to think hard about this. I couldn't come up with a list, because I don't believe I'm all that special. But I do know that my family says I'm a gentle person." There was an audible gasp of astonishment that this wonderful woman could not see her own gifts. Many of us have never stopped to think what our real talents are. Alternatively, we may think that we know what they are but we believe that to acknowledge them is to show undue pride. Either of these approaches may hold us back from the fullness of life to which we are called. It is part of the adult life of faith, however, to recognize what skills and capabilities God has blessed us with and then decide, in gratitude, to use those gifts to help build God's kingdom here on earth.
