Dear Parishioners,

“This man welcomes sinners and eats with them (Luke 15: 2).” This was the complaint of the Pharisees and scribes about Jesus in this Sunday’s Gospel. The Lord responds to their complaint with three very familiar parables—the lost sheep, the lost coin and the prodigal son. All three of these parables teach us about the Father’s great love for each of us, sinners. Our Father in heaven has made us, saved us and redeemed us with the death and rising of his divine Son, and filled us with his grace with the outpouring of his Holy Spirit. We belong to him. He made us for himself. This is how he loves us and wants us to be in a right relationship with him—a relationship without sin, especially serious sin. So, when we do sin, and unfortunately we do, we make the choice to separate ourselves from God’s love. In turn, God desperately seeks our return to him. His invitation is constant. He searches for us for our return like a lost sheep, a lost coin, a lost son or daughter. When we do make our return—as the Scriptures says—there is great rejoicing in heaven! It is truly remarkable to ponder the depth of God’s love for each of us. At the same time, we need to consider our desire to return to the Father’s love from our sin, our sinful ways. God’s love for us inspires contrition. God’s love for us should lead us to the regular confession of our sins in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. God’s love for us sinners is not to be taken for granted nor is it to be presumed. God’s love, a Father’s love for his sons and daughters, is for us to love him completely in return.

The Cathedral Parish has been blessed over these past three and a half years with the excellent and generous service of Nora Martin, our parish secretary. Nora has been the steady and most competent anchor in our parish office. Many of you know Nora personally. For quite some time Nora has discerned the Lord’s invitation to her to return to her native Colombia, South America, to do missionary work. We bid farewell to Nora this September 20, 2019, as she takes this next step in her Christian life. Nora’s departure is bittersweet for me. She has been a most loyal, faithful and outstanding collaborator in her work in the parish and I will miss her. At the same time, I rejoice in the work God is doing in her for the benefit of others in spreading his saving Word. Please join me in giving thanks to God for the blessing of Nora’s service and also to Nora for her great work. Also, please join me in keeping Nora in our prayers.

Next Sunday, September 22, 2019, the annual Blue Mass will take place at the 9:30 AM Mass. This Mass is the opportunity to pray especially for those in public service—Police, Fire Protectors, and all First Responders—who keep us from harm’s way. The Archdiocesan Respect Life observance will be on Sunday, September 29, 2019, at the Sunday 6:30 PM Mass. On Sunday, October 6, 2019, the annual White Mass—for those in the medical profession—will take place at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass and the Archdiocesan Rosary will take place at 5:30 PM.

EL PADRE INDULGENTE

El adjetivo “pródigo” no se usa mucho en nuestra conversación diaria, pero es una palabra muy asidua para nosotros cuando la vinculamos a la historia de Jesús acerca del padre y sus dos hijos. La ley judía en tiempos de Jesús permitía que el hijo primogénito heredara dos terceras partes de las propiedades de su padre. Si habían otros hijos menores, éstos se repartían la otra tercera parte. Normalmente, dicha repartición tenía lugar después de la muerte del padre, pero en el evangelio de hoy el hijo menor no puede esperar, así pues, exige su parte y se va sin prometer regreso. Después de un corto período de extravagancias imprudentes, se le acaba el dinero y tiene que hacer una de las labores más humildes, esto es, cuidar de los cerdos. Se arma, pues, de valor y decide regresar a casa, esperando un recibimiento frío. En sus planes está confesar su culpa y pedirle a su padre que lo acepte como a un siervo, ya que no es digno de llamarse hijo. Todos sabemos cómo termina la historia: el padre corre al encuentro del joven, lo viste con la ropa mejor y ofrece un banquete en su honor. El hijo mayor reacciona con hostilidad frente a estos acontecimientos, aunque tiene garantizado un lugar en el corazón de su padre y una buena herencia en el futuro. Aparentemente le guarda rencor no sólo a este hermano caprichoso, sino también a su padre. El padre sabe cómo perdonar; tristemente el hijo mayor no ha aprendido a hacerlo. El padre no sólo perdona sino que olvida la ofensa. Lo que *hizo* el hijo no tiene importancia comparado con quién *es* el hijo: el hijo amado. Cada vez que leemos o escuchamos esta historia tenemos la oportunidad de reflexionar y preguntarnos si hemos reaccionado como el hijo menor o como el mayor, y si nos esforzamos en actuar como Dios actúa con nosotros, esto es, como un padre indulgente.

Evangelization Schooled by the Saints

This Sunday, September 15, 2019, is Catechetical Sunday. On this day we honor in a special way all those persons responsible for handing on the Catholic Faith to the next generation of Christians. St. Robert Bellarmine, the patron saint of Catechists, whose story was relatively unknown to me only a few years ago. As a newly ordained priest I was sent as a parochial vicar to a parish in Bucks County under his patronage, St. Robert's in Warrington. I asked my pastor if he had any resources he could share with me so that I might learn a little about St. Robert's life and times. He offered me a book about St. Robert and it served as not only an introductory course for me in who this man was, but the place that the Lives of the Saints ought to have in our spiritual lives more generally.

St. Robert (1542-1621) was a priest of the Society of Jesus, the Jesuit Order, founded by St. Ignatius Loyola. Among other things, the Jesuits exercise a special charism for teaching and preaching the Catholic Faith. In the course of his life St. Robert would not only grow in notoriety as a talented preacher and teacher but exercised that gift in many different capacities. Some of his roles included serving as rector of the Roman College (now called the Gregorian) a papal delegate and Cardinal Bishop of Capua in his native Italy.

One role that St. Robert exercised for a time as a young Jesuit was as a teacher of rhetoric (speech) to young persons who today might be regarded as being in high school. It was among his first teaching experiences. The biographer records St. Robert's later reflections on this time for us: *"I taught my pupils as well as I knew how and in order to acquire some standing with them used to introduce philosophical questions into my lessons on rhetoric."*¹

That simple admission may not seem like a lot on its face. Any first year teacher can attest to a certain feeling of inadequacy before a classroom full of young people. Operative in that persons' mind is a simultaneous desire of communicating a lesson and garnering the respect of one's pupils. St. Robert experienced the same struggles I was experiencing as a young priest, learning to teach in a classroom. Upon learning that, I realized that St. Robert along with so many other saints and blessed were not alien to the trials and tribulations of everyday life. They became saints, they were not born as such.

When trying to grow in the Christian life, it is important for us to look to those who know the way. One spiritual writer summarizes this relationship between growing in virtues (those good habits that make us good) and the example of the saints: *"The contemplation of virtue, not as an abstraction but as a historic fact in the lives of persons we love and esteem renders it more desirable, for we are moved to imitate them."*²

As another school year gets underway, we'd do well to pick up a little spiritual reading and allow the saints to "school" us. Begin with a patron saint, your namesake or the one whose intercession you sought at Confirmation. A good biography need not be overly detailed or cumbersome. Their journeys with Christ show us that holiness is possible for all, one day, one step at a time. St. Robert, pray for us!
