

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday of Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday. We continue to celebrate our Lord's Resurrection from the dead this Sunday and every day until Pentecost Sunday, the conclusion of the fifty days of Easter. The Resurrection of our Lord is indeed an event that happened once in history but also happens now. The eternal Son of God went to the cross for us and so his death is eternal, present to everyone in every time. The same eternal Son of God was raised from the dead for us and so his resurrection is likewise eternal, present to everyone in every time. All that we hear about the Resurrection of Jesus in the Gospels, we hear with the ears of faith today, confident that the gifts given in history are given anew. Today, as the Gospel of John reveals, we receive the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of our sins. We follow the witness and example of Saint Thomas and believe Jesus is truly risen. Let us constantly profess our faith in the Risen Lord. Our faith in the Resurrection needs to be firm and comprehensive. Let us listen carefully these weeks of Easter Time to the prayers and the readings from Sacred Scripture at Sunday Mass to deepen our faith in the Resurrection. *Christ is risen! PILGRIMAGE OPPORTUNITIES

Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel 2020-2021

The following components can be combined to create a pilgrimage to the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel:

- ⇒ Presentation on Saint Katharine Drexel
- ⇒ Guided Tour of the Cathedral Basilica
- ⇒ Mass (public or separate) and opportunity for Confessions
- ⇒ Prayer to begin or end the day of pilgrimage (suggestions for the group)

The maximum number of people for a pilgrimage is 50 total, students and adults. For lower school students, the ratio of students to adults must be 10 to 1, and for middle and upper school students, the ratio must be 15 to 1. At this time, face coverings or masks must be worn by all who enter the Cathedral Basilica and social distancing must take place wherever possible. The pilgrimage opportunity is offered on Wednesdays by appointment, but note that the order of these components is flexible as is the time of day, all subject to available resources.
