PILGRIMAGE OPPORTUNITIES

Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel

The following components can be combined to create a pilgrimage to the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel:

- ⇒ Presentation on Saint Katharine Drexel
- ⇒ Guided Tour of the Cathedral Basilica
- ⇒ Mass (public or separate) and opportunity for Confessions
- ⇒ Prayer to begin or end the day of pilgrimage (suggestions for the group)

The maximum number of people for a pilgrimage is 50 total, students and adults. For lower school students, the ratio of students to adults must be 10 to 1, and for middle and upper school students, the ratio must be 15 to 1. At this time, face coverings or masks must be worn by all who enter the Cathedral Basilica and social distancing must take place wherever possible. The pilgrimage opportunity is offered on Wednesdays by appointment, but note that the order of these components is flexible as is the time of day, all subject to available resources.

**THE CATHEDRAL BASILICA OF

HVAC RENOVATION PROJECT
JJ WHITE INC PROJECT # 18-MK-0020**

JJ White’s HVAC renovation project will bring significant improvements and efficiencies to the HVAC and electrical systems that serve the Basilica, Chapel, and Rectory. Currently, The Basilica receives its heating, cooling and power from the Administration building. When this project is completed the Basilica complex will have a dedicated power source from Exelon. The power source will be upgraded from an antiquated 2 phase system to a 480 volt 3 phase system. Heating and cooling equipment is being installed in the Chapel basement and roof, which will make the Basilica complex self-sufficient for its heating and cooling systems. All local permits and approvals were obtained prior to the start of the project, including Historical Commission review.

Major components of the project include the following:

- A new air handling unit is being installed in the Chapel basement. This will improve air distribution and efficiency in the Chapel area.
- A new air cooled chiller is being installed on the Chapel roof. This will serve the cooling needs for the entire Basilica complex. An architectural screen wall will be placed around the chiller to maintain the appearance of the Chapel exterior.
- New heat exchangers and pumps are being installed to improve the efficiency of the existing piping systems.
- New steam boilers are being installed in the Chapel basement to provide the heat source for the Basilica complex.
- A new natural gas service is being provided to feed the new boilers and existing appliances in the Basilica Complex.
- The control system in the Chapel is being upgraded to improve efficiency.
- Each work area has been monitored for asbestos containing materials. The materials were removed prior to beginning the work in each area.
- Our target completion date is December 31st 2021.
