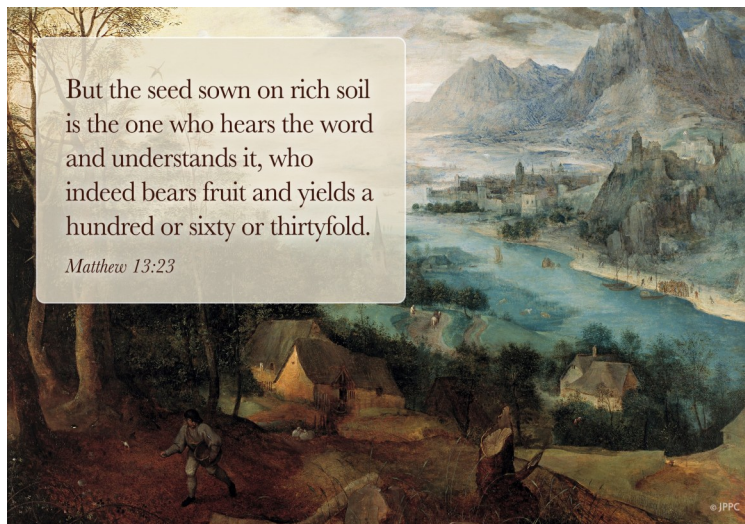

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This Sunday we hear Jesus instruct us with the parable of the sower in the Holy Gospel (see Matthew 13: 1-23). The seed that is sown is the saving Word of God, the Word that brings us happiness in this life and leads us to eternal life. The parable reminds us as followers of Christ to have hearts ready to receive the Word so that it can bear fruit in our Christian lives. What does this mean? The Word of God is Jesus, the Son of God, spoken to us by his Father with the breath of the Holy Spirit. The Sacred Scriptures, inspired by the Holy Spirit, are the texts of all that the Father wants us to know from his Son through the Church. As we listen, as we read, the Sacred Scriptures, we encounter the living Word. This encounter requires faith in the Word, a readiness to make it our own and live by it, and to have confidence in its unfailing Truth. The Word of God leads us to turn away from sin and to turn to God's ways. A heart that is ready to receive the Word of God is a heart ready and open to receive Jesus. I encourage you to read the Bible in your home regularly. I encourage you as you hear the Biblical Readings at Holy Mass to do so with ears attentive to the voice of God himself. In his way, the seed of the Word sown in your heart indeed will bear much fruit.

This Thursday, July 16, 2026, is the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This midsummer commemoration of our Blessed Mother is another reminder of how Mary is always near to us, praying for us, listening to us and ready to come to our aid. Consider observing this day in honor of Our Lady with attendance at Mass and/or praying the Holy Rosary. Mary always leads us to her Son, the Divine Word that took flesh in her virginal womb.

Every day, one of our priests is on call for emergency situations and parishioners are encouraged to call the Parish Office when the need arises. However, as soon as someone becomes seriously ill, the time has arrived for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. As someone nears death, Holy Communion as Viaticum, the divine food for the journey to heaven, should be arranged. As your parish priests, we want to be with you and your family member for these important sacramental occasions. Please call us!

Each Sunday, in the Universal Prayer, we pray together for the sick, especially the sick members of our Cathedral Parish. In Christ, in his holy Body and Blood, we become profoundly one with those for whom we pray during Mass. May the sick members of our parish and all the sick we know have the benefit of our prayers during Holy Mass and be strengthened in their difficulties.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the support of the religious education programs in the Cathedral Parish. 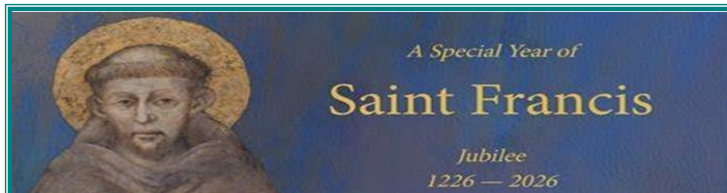

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy celebramos el décimo quinto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En este domingo, escuchamos a Jesús instruirnos mediante la parábola del sembrador en el santo evangelio (véase Mateo 13, 1-23). La semilla que se siembra es la Palabra salvadora de Dios, la Palabra que nos trae felicidad en esta vida y nos conduce a la vida eterna. Como seguidores de Cristo, la parábola nos recuerda que debemos tener corazones dispuestos a recibir la Palabra para que pueda dar fruto en nuestra vida cristiana. ¿Qué significa esto? La Palabra de Dios es Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, que nos es comunicada por el Padre mediante el aliento del Espíritu Santo. Las Sagradas Escrituras, inspiradas por el Espíritu Santo, contienen todo lo que el Padre quiere que sepamos sobre su Hijo a través de la Iglesia. Al escuchar y leer las Sagradas Escrituras, nos encontramos con la Palabra viva. Este encuentro requiere fe en la Palabra, disposición para hacerla nuestra y vivir conforme a ella, así como confianza en su verdad infalible. La Palabra de Dios nos lleva a apartarnos del pecado y a volvernos hacia los caminos de Dios. Un corazón dispuesto a recibir la Palabra de Dios es un corazón listo y abierto para recibir a Jesús. Los animo a leer la Biblia en sus hogares con regularidad. Los animo a escuchar las lecturas bíblicas en la Santa Misa con oídos atentos a la voz de Dios mismo. De este modo, la semilla de la Palabra sembrada en sus corazones dará, sin duda, mucho fruto.

Este jueves, 16 de julio del 2026, celebramos la memoria de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo. Esta conmemoración de nuestra Santísima Madre, a mediados del verano, es un recordatorio más de que María está siempre cerca de nosotros: intercediendo, escuchándonos y dispuesta a acudir en nuestra ayuda. Consideren honrar a Nuestra Señora en este día asistiendo a Misa o rezando el Santo Rosario. María siempre nos conduce a su Hijo, el Verbo Divino que se encarnó en su seno virginal.

Todos los días, uno de nuestros sacerdotes está de guardia para situaciones de emergencia; animamos a los feligreses a llamar a la oficina parroquial cuando surja la necesidad. No obstante, tan pronto como alguien enferma gravemente, es el momento de administrar el sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos. Cuando alguien se acerca al final de su vida, es conveniente organizar la administración de la Sagrada Comunión como Viático, el alimento divino para el viaje al cielo. Como sacerdotes de su parroquia, deseamos acompañarlos a usted y a su familiar en estos momentos sacramentales tan importantes. ¡Por favor, llámenos!

Cada domingo, durante la Oración Universal, rezamos juntos por los enfermos, especialmente por aquellos miembros de nuestra parroquia de la Catedral que padecen enfermedad. En Cristo, en su santo Cuerpo y Sangre, nos unimos profundamente a quienes encomendamos en oración durante la Misa.
