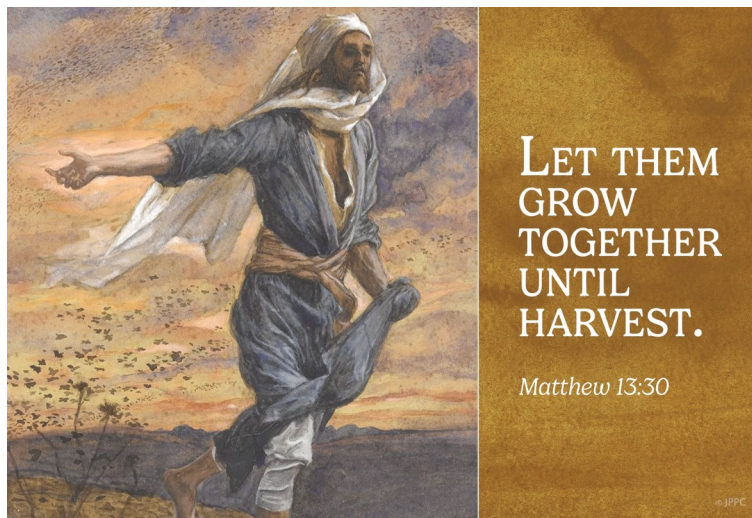

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This Sunday again the Divine Teacher instructs us with parables in the Holy Gospel (see Matthew 13:24-23). The focus of the Lord this Sunday is the kingdom of heaven. This term, the kingdom of heaven, has many layers of meaning as it is used in Sacred Scripture. The kingdom is not so much a place. It is an experience, an experience that begins with this life and continues into eternal life. The kingdom is the reign of Christ at work and alive in all those purchased for this kingdom by his death and resurrection. From the day of our Baptism, and renewed with every celebration of the Sacraments, especially with our regular reception of Holy Communion, we progressively enter more profoundly into our relationship with Christ—as sons and daughters of the same Father—with the divine life given and needed to live the Gospel fully. The Gospel fully lived within us and among us is the kingdom of heaven. The fullest realization of the Gospel perfectly lived will be for us in heaven when we will be completely united with Jesus in eternal praise of our heavenly Father. The Gospel today calls us to nurture our life in the kingdom, to protect it, and to witness to it.

This Wednesday, July 22, 2026, is the Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene. Usually when we first think of Saint Mary Magdalene, we recall her rather sinful life and the Lord’s generous forgiveness of her. While this is very much a part of the story of this New Testament Saint, the Sacred Liturgy has us focus on her privileged role as a witness to the resurrection of the Lord. We know our sins and seek the mercy and forgiveness of the Lord. All this is very good and to be encouraged strongly. However, it is only one side of discipleship—turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel. The other side is to manifest the Risen Lord. Mary Magdalene, the forgiven sinner, was entrusted before all others to announce the great joy of the Resurrection. What does this mean for us? The world needs to hear about the Risen Lord—from each of us. The Risen Lord is announced by us above all by example and then by words. We do this when Christ is obviously at the center of our lives and directs our thoughts and actions. We do when we are able to suggest this to others, especially when they are separated in their thoughts and actions from the Risen Lord. Let us ask for the heavenly help of Saint Mary Magdalene to pray for us sinners and to help us to announce the Risen Lord. *Saint Mary Magdalene, pray for us!*

This week Sister Marie Faustina, RSM, our Parish Manager, begins a new assignment at Saint Clare Convent in Gypsum, Colorado. We thank Sister so very much for her service and fine work in our Cathedral Parish over these past two years and send with her our prayers and good wishes. We welcome this week Sister Marie Mechtild, RSM, as well, to our Cathedral Parish staff.

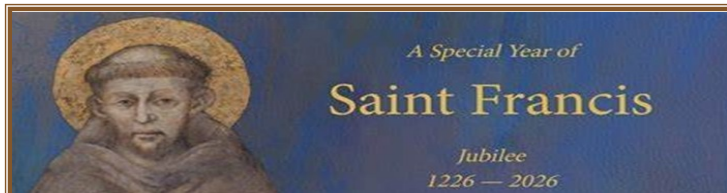

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy celebramos el décimo sexto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Una vez más, este domingo, el Divino Maestro nos instruye mediante parábolas en el santo evangelio (véase Mateo 13, 24-23). El centro de la enseñanza del Señor este domingo es el Reino de los Cielos. Este término, el Reino de los Cielos, posee múltiples niveles de significado en la Sagrada Escritura. El Reino no es tanto un lugar; es una experiencia, una experiencia que comienza en esta vida y continúa en la vida eterna. El Reino es el reinado de Cristo, vivo y activo en todos aquellos que fueron adquiridos para este Reino mediante su muerte y resurrección. Desde el día de nuestro Bautismo, y renovándonos en cada celebración de los sacramentos, especialmente al recibir regularmente la Sagrada Comunión, entramos progresivamente y con mayor profundidad en nuestra relación con Cristo (como hijos e hijas de un mismo Padre), contando con la vida divina que se nos ha dado y que necesitamos para vivir el evangelio en plenitud. El evangelio vivido plenamente en nuestro interior y entre nosotros es el Reino de los Cielos. La realización más plena del evangelio vivido a la perfección tendrá lugar para nosotros en el cielo, cuando estemos completamente unidos a Jesús en la alabanza eterna a nuestro Padre celestial. El evangelio de hoy nos invita a cultivar nuestra vida en el Reino, a protegerla y a dar testimonio de ella.

Este miércoles, 22 de julio del 2026, celebramos la fiesta de Santa María Magdalena. Por lo general, al pensar en Santa María Magdalena, recordamos su vida marcada por el pecado y el generoso perdón que recibió del Señor. Si bien esto forma parte importante de la historia de esta santa del Nuevo Testamento, la Sagrada Liturgia nos invita a centrarnos en su papel privilegiado como testigo de la resurrección del Señor. Nosotros somos conscientes de nuestros pecados y buscamos la misericordia y el perdón del Señor; todo esto es muy bueno y debe fomentarse encarecidamente. Sin embargo, es solo una faceta del discipulado: apartarse del pecado y ser fieles al evangelio. La otra faceta consiste en manifestar al Señor Resucitado. A María Magdalena, la pecadora perdonada, se le confió, antes que a nadie, la misión de anunciar la gran alegría de la Resurrección. ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros? El mundo necesita oír hablar del Señor Resucitado, y necesita escucharlo de cada uno de nosotros. Nosotros anunciamos al Señor Resucitado, ante todo, con el ejemplo y, posteriormente, con nuestras palabras. Hacemos esto cuando Cristo ocupa claramente el centro de nuestras vidas y guía nuestros pensamientos y acciones. Lo hacemos cuando somos capaces de transmitir esto a los demás, especialmente cuando sus pensamientos y acciones los mantienen alejados del Señor Resucitado. Pidamos la ayuda celestial de Santa María Magdalena para que interceda por nosotros, pecadores, y nos ayude a anunciar al Señor Resucitado. *¡Santa María Magdalena, ruega por nosotros!*

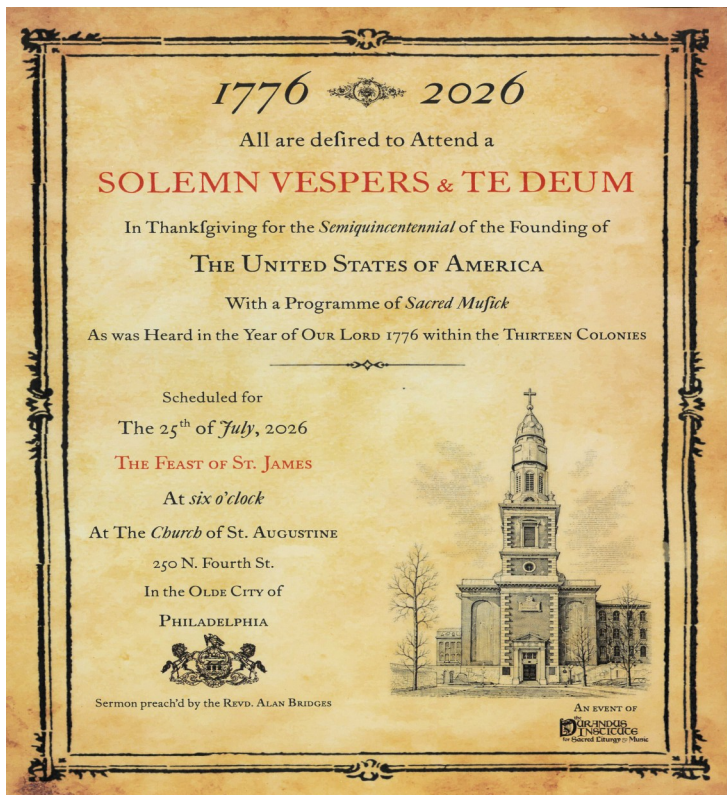
