Dear Parishioners,

This is the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Holy Gospel for this Sunday (Mt 11:25-30) offers a much-needed invitation to all of us. “Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light (Mt 11: 28-30).” Difficulties and hardships abound for many of us. In the midst of them we hear Lord speaking to each of us, inviting us, to come to him who holds the promise of peace, of rest, of tranquility. He does not place any more on us than we can handle. Rather, he takes from us our burdens with the support of his love and grace. I encourage you to bring to the loving Heart of Christ all that worries and concerns you. Bringing these burdens to him does make them disappear. Bringing them to him reminds us rather clearly that he is with us and carries them for us. *Come to me all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.*

Two major events combine this weekend—the conclusion of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and the 250th anniversary of the founding of the nation. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, especially with the pilgrimage with the Most Blessed Sacrament from the tomb of Saint Katharine Drexel here in our Cathedral Basilica to the tomb of Saint John Neumann at Saint Peter’s Church at 5th Street and Girard Avenue, reminds us of the power and gift of the Holy Eucharist to keep us on the path of holiness of life. The anniversary of our nation reminds us, among many things, of the religious freedom that we have to celebrate and profess our faith outside our church walls. As we adore our Lord in his Holy Body and Blood, we also pray that God may always bless America!

Summer is a good time for some additional reading, especially some spiritual reading. I encourage you to read the life of a saint or a book on prayer. This September, Archbishop Fulton Sheen will be beatified. In addition to being a great preacher and orator, Venerable Fulton Sheen was a great writer of many books. I recommend three of his works to you for some summer reading—*Life of Christ, World’s First Love, and Life is Worth Living.*

Plans are underway for our fall sessions for the Christian Initiation of Adults. If you are interested in being a parish sponsor for one of our adult candidates, please contact the Parish Office, 215-561-1313. The parish sponsor does not need to be an expert in the knowledge of the Faith. Rather, the parish sponsor is someone who guides, who mentors, the candidate on the journey to follow Jesus faithfully in his Church.

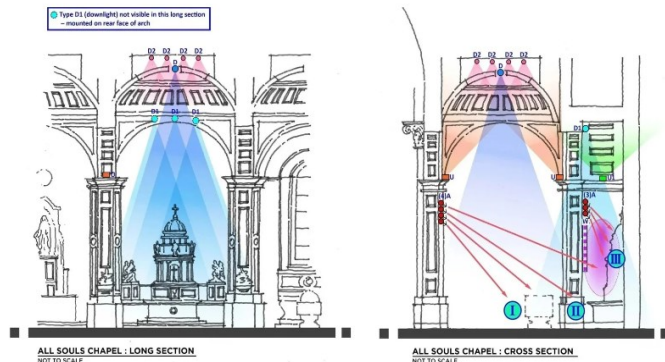

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el décimo cuarto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El santo evangelio de este domingo (Mt 11, 25-30) nos dirige a todos una invitación muy necesaria: “Vengan a mí, todos los que están fatigados y agobiados por la carga y yo les daré alivio. Tomen mi yugo sobre ustedes y aprendan de mí, que soy manso y humilde de corazón, y encontrarán descanso, porque mi yugo es suave y mi carga, ligera (Mt 11, 28-30).” Muchos de nosotros enfrentamos dificultades y adversidades. En medio de ellas, escuchamos al Señor hablarnos a cada uno e invitarnos a acudir a Él, quien posee la promesa de paz, descanso y tranquilidad. Él no nos impone más de lo que podemos soportar; al contrario, nos alivia de nuestras cargas mediante el apoyo de su amor y su gracia. Los animo a llevar al amoroso Corazón de Cristo todo aquello que les preocupe o inquiete. Llevarle estas cargas no hace que desaparezcan mágicamente, pero nos recuerda claramente que Él está con nosotros y las lleva por nosotros. “Vengan a mí, todos los que están fatigados y agobiados por la carga, y yo los aliviaré.”

Este fin de semana coinciden dos acontecimientos importantes: la conclusión de la Peregrinación Eucarística Nacional y el 250° aniversario de la fundación de la nación. La Peregrinación Eucarística Nacional, especialmente el recorrido con el Santísimo Sacramento desde la tumba de Santa Katharine Drexel, aquí en nuestra Catedral Basílica, hasta la tumba de San Juan Neumann en la iglesia de San Pedro (en la calle 5 y la avenida Girard), nos recuerda el poder y el don de la Sagrada Eucaristía para mantenernos en el camino de la santidad de vida. El aniversario de nuestra nación nos recuerda, entre otras cosas, la libertad religiosa que tenemos para celebrar y profesar nuestra fe más allá de los muros de la iglesia. Mientras adoramos a nuestro Señor en su Santo Cuerpo y Sangre, ¡oremos también para que Dios bendiga siempre a Estados Unidos!

El verano es una buena época para lecturas adicionales, especialmente de carácter espiritual. Los animo a leer la vida de algún santo o un libro sobre la oración. Este mes de septiembre será beatificado el Arzobispo Fulton Sheen. Además de ser un gran predicador y orador, el Venerable Fulton Sheen fue un prolífico escritor. Les recomiendo tres de sus obras para sus lecturas de verano: *Vida de Cristo, El primer amor del mundo y El mundo, el alma y las cosas.*

Ya estamos preparando las sesiones de otoño para la Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos. Si le interesa ser padrino o madrina parroquial de alguno de nuestros candidatos adultos, por favor comuníquese con la Oficina Parroquial al 215-561-1313. No es necesario ser un experto en la fe para desempeñar esta función; más bien, se trata de alguien que guía y acompaña al candidato en su camino para seguir fielmente a Jesús dentro de su Iglesia.

Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad hacia la parroquia de la Catedral.
