Dear Parishioners,

This is the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel for this Sunday (see Matthew 14: 13-21) reveals the great provident love of the Lord for us, and especially so in the Holy Eucharist. Let us remember this occasion with great joy for all the blessings that Saint Katharine’s relics bring to our Cathedral Basilica and the countless people who come to visit her tomb. I encourage you to turn to Saint Katharine as a powerful intercessor in Heaven. Ask her heavenly help to provide for all your many intentions. Take some time to visit her tomb and pray at her tomb when possible. *Saint Katharine Drexel, pray for us!*

This Thursday, August 6, 2026, is the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord! This commemoration reminds us of the promise of glory, the promise of heaven, to all those who are faithful to the way of the Lord—his Word and his Cross. Plan to celebrate this feast with Holy Mass at the 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

The Cathedral Parish is blessed with many fine dedicated liturgical ministers for the celebration of Mass on Sundays and all throughout the week. Low-Gluten Hosts

For Catholics who have been diagnosed with Celiac Disease, or any similar gluten intolerance, we have the availability of low-gluten altar breads (hosts) that can be prepared for consecration.

These hosts, produced by the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in Clyde, Missouri, have been tested to contain less than .001% (10ppm) gluten. In this way, they are both approved for use at Holy Mass and are safe for almost all people who have a gluten intolerance. Additionally, both in storage and throughout the celebration of Mass, these hosts are kept separate, for the sake of those who have more extreme sensitivity to gluten.

To request that a low-gluten host be prepared for you, please come to the sacristy before Mass and make this known to the priest and/or sacristan, who will offer further instructions.
