Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel for this Sunday takes us to another dimension of our faith (see Matthew 16: 13-20). Over the past few Sundays, the Lord has called us to deeper and personal faith in him, our Savior and Redeemer. This Sunday as we witness the dialogue between the Lord and Saint Peter, we come to recognize that our faith in Christ includes faith in his Church. Faith in his Church is not faith in the human membership of the Church. Rather, it is faith in his Church as she extends—through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit—Christ himself to us in the Word, in the Sacraments and in good works. Christ builds his Church on Peter! Christ builds his Church on the faith of Peter who recognized him as the Son of the Living God. Christ and his Church are one. This has many levels of meaning for us. Some of these meanings include the awareness and confidence in the presence of Christ in the Church—in the Word proclaimed, in the Sacraments celebrated, and in all her good works carried out for the benefit of others. Also, we need to work together to preserve, promote and protect the presence of Christ among us as part of Christ’s Body, the Church. All of this has its beginnings in our personal and abiding faith in Christ himself. Let us pray this Sunday for a lively, confident and joyful faith in Christ and his Church.

This week on August 25, 26 and 27, 2026, Archbishop Pérez will gather with the administrators and teachers of all the Archdiocesan High Schools and Elementary Schools, as well as Directors/ Coordinators/ Administrators of Religious Education, from across the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. “Reclaiming in Christ, Our Hope, Our Light and Our Joy” is the theme of these days. You are encouraged to pray for the spiritual fruitfulness of these days of meetings between the Archbishop and all those who collaborate with him in passing on our Catholic Faith to those in our schools and religious education programs.

VENERATION OF THE MAJOR (FIRST CLASS) RELICS OF SAINT MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF PHILADELPHIA

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy celebramos el vigésimo primer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El evangelio de este domingo nos lleva a otra dimensión de nuestra fe (véase Mateo 16, 13-20). En los últimos domingos, el Señor nos ha llamado a tener una fe más profunda y personal en Él, nuestro Salvador y Redentor. Este domingo, al presenciar el diálogo entre el Señor y San Pedro, reconocemos que nuestra fe en Cristo incluye la fe en su Iglesia. La fe en su Iglesia no es fe en los miembros humanos de la misma; más bien, es fe en su Iglesia en cuanto que ella nos acerca — mediante el poder y la presencia del Espíritu Santo — al mismo Cristo a través de la Palabra, los sacramentos y las buenas obras. ¡Cristo edifica su Iglesia sobre Pedro! Cristo edifica su Iglesia sobre la fe de Pedro, quien lo reconoció como el Hijo del Dios vivo. Cristo y su Iglesia son uno solo. Esto tiene múltiples significados para nosotros. Entre ellos, se incluye la conciencia y la confianza en la presencia de Cristo en la Iglesia: en la Palabra proclamada, en los sacramentos celebrados y en todas las buenas obras realizadas en beneficio de los demás. Asimismo, debemos trabajar juntos para preservar, promover y proteger la presencia de Cristo entre nosotros como parte del Cuerpo de Cristo, que es la Iglesia. Todo esto tiene su origen en nuestra fe personal y constante en el mismo Cristo. Oremos este domingo para tener una fe viva, confiada y alegre en Cristo y en su Iglesia.

Esta semana, los días 25, 26 y 27 de agosto de 2026, el Arzobispo Pérez se reunirá con los administradores y maestros de todas las escuelas secundarias y primarias de la Arquidiócesis, así como con los directores, coordinadores y administradores de educación religiosa de toda la Arquidiócesis de Filadelfia. El lema de estas jornadas es: “Reivindicándonos en Cristo: nuestra esperanza, nuestra luz y nuestra alegría.” Los animamos a orar por la fecundidad espiritual de estos días de encuentro entre el Arzobispo y todos aquellos que colaboran con él en la transmisión de nuestra fe católica a quienes participan en nuestras escuelas y programas de educación religiosa.

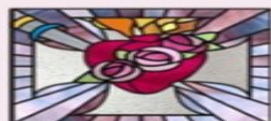
