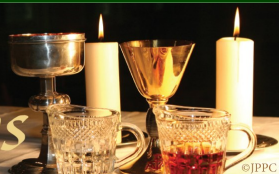

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Lord gives us great confidence in today's Gospel in his nearness to us when we pray together. "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them (Matthew 18: 20)." The most excellent experience of Christians at prayer together is when we are assembled by the Lord himself for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. In fact, when the Church identifies the multiple presences of Christ in the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, she identifies Christ presence *par excellence* in his Body and Blood, in his Word, in the priest and among the people at prayer. This presence of Christ when we are at prayer extends to so many other occasions. When we pray with our families in our homes, when we join others to pray the Holy Rosary, when we pray before a meeting or any gathering. Sometimes we are reticent to pray with others outside of Mass, even with family members. If we have the Lord's divine word that he is with us when we pray with just two or three others, why would we not do so. May the lesson of today's Holy Gospel encourage us to invite others to join us in prayer before meals, before an important conversation, with someone who is sick, whenever we can do so. This is a tremendous witness to the power of God at work among us.

This Monday, September 7, 2026, is Labor Day. For many of us, Labor Day signals the unofficial end of summer and the return to a regular routine of activities. This last of the summer holidays was instituted as a tribute to the American laborers and their contribution to the prosperity of our country. We continue to observe Labor Day in this way. For Christians, this holiday gives us the opportunity to recognize the dignity of all workers and all work and to ask the Lord to bless the work of our hands. This Labor Day let us ask for the heavenly help of Saint Joseph, the Worker, to intercede for all workers. Let us also pray for all those seeking employment that soon they will find work.

Holy Mass for Labor Day will be celebrated in the Cathedral Chapel at 9:00 AM. Following Holy Mass, everyone is invited to pray the Holy Rosary for the those in need of work. The Basilica and the Parish Office are closed on Labor Day.

This past Thursday, September 3, 2026, more than twenty adult inquirers and candidates for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist gathered in the Neumann Room for their first session of the new season for catechetical formation. Again, this year, we have a remarkable number of candidates for our small parish community. I mention this good news for two reasons. We are still in need of parish sponsors for these candidates. If you would like to accompany any of these adults on their journey of faith formation for the Sacraments, please contact me. Also, everyone is always welcome to attend the Thursday evening catechetical sessions as announced in the parish bulletin if the topic is of special interest. Please keep our many inquirers and candidates in your prayers.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the national collection for the Black and Indian Mission. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy celebramos el vigésimo tercer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En el evangelio de hoy, el Señor nos transmite una gran confianza al asegurarnos su cercanía cuando oramos juntos: “Porque donde dos o tres se reúnen en mi nombre, ahí estoy yo en medio de ellos” (Mateo 18, 20). La experiencia más sublime de la oración comunitaria cristiana ocurre cuando nos reunimos, convocados por el propio Señor, para celebrar la Sagrada Liturgia. De hecho, al señalar las diversas formas en que Cristo se hace presente durante la Sagrada Liturgia, la Iglesia destaca su presencia *por excelencia* en su Cuerpo y su Sangre, en su Palabra, en el sacerdote y en el pueblo reunido en oración. Esta presencia de Cristo durante la oración se extiende a muchas otras ocasiones: cuando oramos en familia en nuestros hogares, cuando nos unimos a otros para rezar el Santo Rosario o cuando oramos antes de una reunión o cualquier encuentro. A veces sentimos cierta reticencia a orar con otras personas fuera de la Misa, incluso con nuestros propios familiares. Si contamos con la promesa divina del Señor de que está con nosotros cuando oramos con tan solo otras dos o tres personas, ¿por qué no habríamos de hacerlo? Que la enseñanza del santo evangelio de hoy nos anime a invitar a los demás a unirse a nosotros en oración antes de las comidas, antes de una conversación importante, junto a un enfermo o siempre que sea posible. Esto constituye un testimonio extraordinario del poder de Dios actuando entre nosotros.

Este lunes, 7 de septiembre del 2026, celebramos el Día del Trabajo. Para muchos de nosotros, esta fecha marca el final no oficial del verano y el retorno a la rutina habitual de actividades. Este último festivo del verano se instauró como homenaje a los trabajadores estadounidenses y a su contribución a la prosperidad de nuestro país, una tradición que mantenemos hasta el día de hoy. Para los cristianos, esta festividad nos brinda la oportunidad de reconocer la dignidad de todos los trabajadores y de toda labor, así como de pedir al Señor que bendiga el trabajo de nuestras manos. En este Día del Trabajo, invoquemos la ayuda celestial de San José Obrero para que interceda por todos los trabajadores. Oremos también por aquellos que buscan empleo, para que pronto encuentren trabajo.
