





O Lord God of hosts hear my prayer; give ear, O God of Jacob! Behold our shield, O God; look on the face of your anointed.


For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.


Christ upon the mountain peak stands alone in glory blazing. Let us, if we dare to speak, with the saints and angels praise him, Kyrie eleison.


Trembling at his feet we saw Moses and Elijah speaking. All the prophets and the Law shout through them their joyful greeting, Kyrie eleison.
