WORDS FROM POPE FRANCIS.....

Reflecting on the words of any Pope helps us to grow in our faith—after all, he is our shepherd, the one who calls us on as one body in Christ. We will offer short excerpts taken from Pope Francis' addresses and homilies since his election which will reflect the themes that we can expect to hear again and again during his pontificate.....

The Holy Spirit Teaches Us To Say “Papa”

In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul wrote, “You have received the spirit of sonship. When we cry, ‘Abbat! Father!’ it is the Spirit himself bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God” (8:15-16)

It is the Spirit himself whom we received in Baptism, who teaches us, who spurs us to say to God, “Father” or rather, “Abba!” which means “Papa” or [“Dad”]. Our God is like this: He is a dad to us. The Holy Spirit creates within us this new condition as children of God. And this is the greatest gift we have received from the paschal mystery of Jesus.

The New Things of God

This is the work of the Holy Spirit: he brings us the new things of God. He comes to us and makes all things new; He changes us. The Spirit changes us!....

You see, the new things of God are not like the novelties of this world, all of which are temporary; they come and go, and we keep looking for more. The new things which God gives to our lives are lasting, not only in the future, when we will be with Him, but today as well. God is even now making all things new; the Holy Spirit is truly transforming us, and through us He also wants to transform the world in which we live.
