WORDS FROM POPE FRANCIS.....

Reflecting on the words of any Pope helps us to grow in our faith—after all, he is our shepherd, the one who calls us on as one body in Christ. We will offer short excerpts taken from Pope Francis' addresses and homilies since his election which will reflect the themes that we can expect to hear again and again during his pontificate.....

God, the Living One, Is Merciful!

Jesus allows a woman who is a sinner to approach him during a meal in the house of a Pharisee, scandalizing those present. Not only does he let the woman approach, but he even forgives her sins, saying, “Her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much; but he who is forgiven little, loves little” (Luke 7:47). Jesus is the incarnation of the Living God, the One who brings life amid so many deeds of death; amid sin, selfishness, and self-absorption. Jesus accepts, loves, uplifts, encourages, forgives, restores the ability to walk, gives back life. Throughout the Gospels we see how Jesus by his words and actions brings the transforming life of God. This was the experience of the woman who anointed the feet of the Lord with ointment: she felt understood, loved, and she responded by a gesture of love; she let herself be touched by God’s mercy, she obtained forgiveness, and she started a new life. God, the Living One, is merciful. Do you agree? Let’s say it together: God, the Living One, is merciful! All together now: God, the Living One, is merciful. Once again: God, the Living One, is merciful!

LECTURAS CICLO A

Primera lectura: *Deuteronomio 8, 2-3. 14b-16a.* Moisés recuerda al Pueblo cómo Dios lo protegió en el desierto y lo alimentó con el maná, que anticipaba misteriosamente el pan de la eucaristía.

Segunda lectura: *1 Corintios 10, 16-17.* Pablo recuerda con apasionamiento que, como el pan es uno, así nosotros que nos alimentamos del único pan que es Cristo debemos conservar la unidad.

Evangelio: *Juan 6, 51-58.* El discurso de Jesús, a partir del milagro de los panes, quiere ser un acercamiento a la eucaristía, en la cual se nos da Cristo: en su cuerpo y en su sangre, como prenda de vida eterna.

CUERPO DE CRISTO

Lo esencial del mensaje de Jesús, el resumen de una vida vivida según las consignas del Padre es esto: Tomad, comed, éstos son mi cuerpo y mi sangre.
