Dear Parishioners,

Greetings in the Lord!

The situation in Northern Iraq is horrific! Pope Francis has appealed to the whole Church to raise up one voice of ceaseless prayer, imploring the Holy Spirit to send the gift of peace to Iraq. The Holy Father has repeated with great urgency the pressing need for all members of the Church to unite in this prayer for the additional intention for an immediate end to the violence and destruction, especially directed at defenseless Christians, in Iraq. Pope Francis with the same urgency calls the international community to protect those who have suffered from such terrible violence and to guarantee assistance for survival.

Our Archbishop invites all the clergy and faithful to be especially mindful of the Holy Father's request for prayer for Iraq this Sunday. You heard this petition in the *Universal Payer* at Mass:

For an immediate end to the violence and destruction of life in Iraq, especially as it is directed to the native Christians, that these evils will be defeated by efforts for peace and justice.

Let us pray to the Lord/Lord, hear our prayer.

Please add this intention to your daily prayers. You are also encouraged to visit the Most Blessed Sacrament for adoration with this intention in mind as well as joining this intention to the Holy Rosary. *Mary, Queen of Peace, pray for us!*

There will be a Holy Hour this Sunday afternoon, August 17, 2014, here at the Cathedral Basilica, beginning at 5:30 PM, to pray especially for the intention of peace in Iraq. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Living Stewardship Now

Inside or Outside?

The Jesus we meet in today's Gospel seems a bit stand -offish. He appears at first to ignore the Canaanite woman's pleas to heal her child! Matthew seems to be suggesting that, until this point in his ministry, Jesus himself thought that his mission was only to the Jewish people. When he is confronted by a Canaanite, and a woman at that, he seems baffled. Her sheer determination to make him listen ensures that he cannot continue to ignore her. More importantly, Jesus acknowledges that her faith in him is equal to that of any of the Jewish people he has met so far. In the end, Jesus praises her faith and heals her daughter. Matthew was writing his Gospel for a community of Jewish Christians who had identified Jesus as the Messiah—the One promised by God to generations of the Jewish people. They were aware, however, that the Christian faith was attracting people of other races and other religions. They would, inevitably, have been struggling to work out how this fit with all the prophecies of the Hebrew scriptures that foretold a Messiah who was destined to save Israel. The meeting between Jesus and the Canaanite woman offers them a clue about how to understand this situation. When Jesus is challenged to heal the outsider, his initial reaction is to refuse; but then he sees her great faith, and this far outweighs the fact that she does not belong to the people he primarily came to save. In this story the new Jewish Christian community must have found help to see that their initial reluctance to admit outsiders was understandable, and then to recognize that God plants faith in others too-and that it is faith rather than background that opens the door into the Kingdom.

Information Session on the Role of Sponsors for those Preparing for the Celebration of the Sacraments

The role of the sponsor is vital in the conversion process of an adult preparing for the celebration of the Sacraments. A sponsor is called to be: 1) A friend and a companion for this adult throughout the process of initiation and beyond. 2) A source of information about Catholic practices and the "nitty-gritty" of daily Christian living. 3) A guide to parish organizations and to meeting other members of the Christian community. 4) A participant in the liturgical ceremonies of the adults, including the sacraments of initiation. 5) A consultant to the priest and catechists on the process of the adults and a participant in discerning the readiness of the individuals for the different stages of initiation. Letters of Eligibility

The Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation require that the godparents and sponsors are eligible to serve in such a role. This role is more than Godparents and sponsors are witceremonial. nesses to the Faith of Church celebrated in these Sacraments of Christian Initiation. Living, sharing, modeling and mentoring the same Faith of the Church is at the heart of the role of godparents and This is the reason why today as sponsors. throughout the history of the Church the role of godparents and sponsors has been taken most seriously. So, the first consideration when making the choice for a godparent and/or sponsor centers on the Faith and a relationship between believers.

As a minimum the Church requires that godparents and sponsors be at least sixteen years of age, have been fully initiated into the Catholic Church—with Baptism, Confirmation and Communion, and, if married, are married in the Church. This all means that the person is living and practicing the Faith, especially with participation in Sunday Mass.

Here at the Cathedral Parish, when a request for a statement of eligibility is made, one of our parish priests will contact you to provide the necessary documentation.



Witness Is What Counts!

Faith can only be communicated through witness, and that means love. Not with our own ideas but with the gospel, lived out in our own lives and brought to life within us by the Holy Spirit. There is, as it were, a synergy between us and the Holy Spirit, and this leads to witness. The Church is carried forward by the saints, who are the very ones who bear this witness. As both John Paul II and Benedict XVI have said, today's world stands in great need of witnesses, not so much of teachers, but rather of witnesses. It's not so much about speaking, but rather speaking with our whole lives: living consistently, the very consistency of our lives! This consistency means living Christianity as an encounter with Jesus that brings me to others, not just as a social label. In terms of society, this is how we are—we are Christians closed in on ourselves. No, not this! Witness is what counts!
