Greetings in the Lord!

Next Sunday is *Catechetical Sunday*. The Bishops of the United States provide this September commemoration so that parishes have the opportunity to highlight and bless the members of their communities who assist the priests with the duty of teaching our Catholic Faith in a more formal way. *Teaching about God's Gift of Forgiveness* is the theme for this year's observance, encouraging teachers of the Faith to give greater emphasis to understanding and celebrating the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation in the course of this academic year.

The word *catechesis* comes from a Greek word meaning “to echo” or “to resound.” So, catechesis describes the important work of the Church to bring to others the Faith of the Church. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church. This *Catechetical Sunday* gives our parish the occasion to acknowledge our own parish catechists. We are fortunate this year to have a number of new catechists—men and women—in English and Spanish—assisting with the formation of parents and godparents for the Baptism of their children, for school age children and adults for the Sacraments of Penance, Confirmation and Communion, as well as with on-going formation in the Catholic Faith. Next Sunday, we will observe *Catechetical Sunday* at the Saturday Evening Anticipated Mass at 5:15 PM with a blessing of our parish catechists. Please keep them in your prayers. If you would like to be a parish catechist, please call the Parish Office. *Catechetical Sunday* is also a reminder that all of us share in the duty to learn more fully our Faith and to pass it on to others.

Also, next Sunday, the Second Collection at all Masses will be for the Black and Indian Missions. The example of our own Saint Katharine Drexel in her own life's work on behalf of the Black and Indian Mission encourages our prayerful and financial support of these missions. Thank you much for your generosity to these special collections and to our parish collections.

Stop and Think

Some of us are reluctant to volunteer for parish ministries and programs. We come to Mass and try not to get involved beyond that. People hang back for many reasons. One reason is fear—fear that anything they give will not be good enough. Others worry that if they offer just once they will be pressured into long-term commitment. Perhaps some don't want to risk being asked to do things they have no interest in or ability for. Not all reluctant volunteers are lacking in generosity; they may put more than their fair share in the collection, give generously to those undergoing hardship at Christmas and Thanksgiving, or send donations to a good cause. If you are one of the hesitant ones, perhaps you need to think hard about what your God-given abilities and interests really are. Perhaps you are good at listening, like to cook, enjoy making things, have good accounting or computer skills. Are you a leader, or do you like to be part of a team? Do you prefer to work behind the scenes? There is something in this parish only you can do! Even if you are sick, homebound, or travel for business, you can pray more. If you are a ministry leader now, how well do you communicate the purpose and activities of your ministry to parishioners? Do you explain the value and success of what you do? Is the name of your ministry confusing to newcomers? Are you truly welcoming and appreciative when someone shows an interest? If you are a committed volunteer, do you share your enthusiasm with other parishioners and invite them to join you and see how they like it? Our parish *survives* if only a few people are committed, but it *thrives* if everyone is included.

Living Stewardship Now: Have you committed your abilities, your time, and your financial resources to your parish for God and the Church? Is your involvement a true reflection of your gratitude to God? Do you need to give more, or give differently?

WORDS FROM POPE FRANCIS.....

Reflecting on the words of any Pope helps us to grow in our faith—after all, he is our shepherd, the one who calls us on as one body in Christ. We will offer short excerpts taken from Pope Francis' addresses and homilies since his election which will reflect the themes that we can expect to hear again and again during his pontificate.....

Martyrdom: The Highest Degree of Witness

To proclaim the gospel, two virtues are essential: courage and patience [acceptance of suffering]. They [Christians who are suffering] are in the Church of "patience." They suffer, and there are more martyrs today than there were in the early centuries of the Church. More martyrs! Our own brothers and sisters. They are suffering! They carry their faith even to martyrdom. However, martyrdom is never a defeat; martyrdom is the highest degree of the witness we must give. We are on the way to martyrdom, as small martyrs: giving up this, doing that... but we are on the way. And they, poor things, they give their lives, but they do so... for love of Jesus, witnessing to Jesus.
