Dear Parishioners, Greetings in the Lord!

Today, at the request of the Holy Father, is a day of prayer for the Synod of Bishops on the Family that will take place next month in Rome. Pope Francis and representative Bishops from around the world will convene at the Vatican to discuss the pastoral challenges of the family in the context of evangelization. The family and the Christian values that support its integrity are often compromised today. It is the duty of all Christians, with the encouragement of those who lead us in the Church, to respond in a proactive way to build up and protect family life as centers of the Faith and Gospel-living. So, today, especially during Mass, we pray together for the upcoming Synod and for families, especially in our parish. There will be an Archdiocesan Holy Hour this evening in the Basilica, beginning at 5:30 PM, to pray for this same intention as well as for the intention of protecting human life, from the first moment of conception until natural death.

Here at the Cathedral Parish, we are praying before each Mass the *World Meeting of Family Prayer*. This prayer reminds us of our immediate need to pray for families, especially those in most trouble, and in anticipation of the World Meeting of Families that will take place here in the Archdiocese next September. You are encouraged to make this prayer your own as you pray at home. Copies of this prayer can be found at http://www.worldmeeting2015.org/about-the-event/ prayer/. We plan to have copies of this same prayer in English and Spanish—pasted in the new edition of the hymnal with the First Sunday of Advent.

Speaking of prayer, you may have noticed in the parish bulletin over the last few months that our parish Charismatic Prayer Group, which meets each week in the Neumann Room, has invited our parishes to send them their prayer requests. Please take advantage of this opportunity for members of our community to lift up to the Lord our needs in prayer.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. The liturgical Memorial of the Holy Rosary is Tuesday, October 7, 2014. We will pray the Holy Rosary together before the 7:15 AM and 12:05 Masses on that day. Of course, everyone is welcome. When you pray your Rosary at home or on the way to work, let us remember one another but especially the intention of the family during the month of October.

DO IT NOW!

Anyone who has ever had to deal with teenagers knows the foot-dragging that can go on over a simple request to do something. "I'll do it in a minute!" Parents know that adolescent "minutes" can be hours. Jesus tells of a father who asked his sons to work in his vineyard. One said "Later" but did the work; the other said "Yes" but did not.
