to pray for me to the Lord our God.

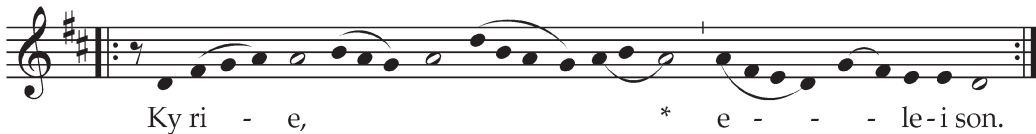

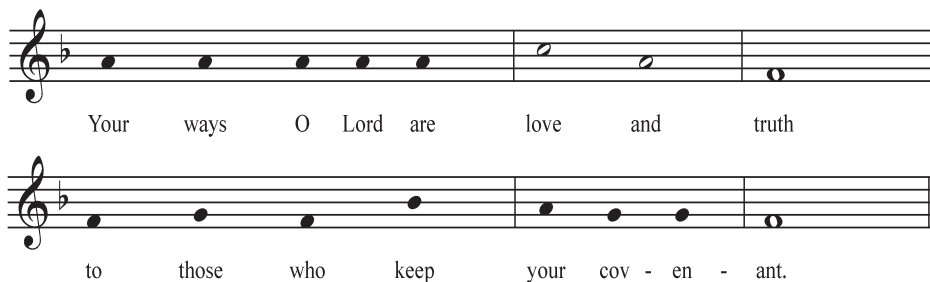
