
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


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Vested as deacons, the newly Ordained kneel before the Bishop who places the Book of the Gospels in the hands of each one.

Lastly, the Bishop and all deacons present give each of the newly Ordained the fraternal kiss.



Do you resolve to conform your way of life always to the example of Christ, of whose Body and Blood you are ministers at the altar?

Do you promise respect and obedience your Ordinary?

Elect: "I do."
