*Today is our Anniversary Day!* Today, we celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Consecration of our beautiful Cathedral Church. Next Sunday, November 30, the First Sunday of Advent, begins our Annual Eucharistic Devotion, the Forty Hours. *Please take note of the insert in today's parish bulletin with the complete schedule for this devotion.* Please make every effort to participate in this wonderful expression of our Catholic Faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. With the First Sunday of Advent next week, all of us are reminded during this week to consider how we will observe this liturgical season to prepare for the Nativity of the Lord, for Christmas. As Christians, we need the four weeks of Advent to prepare, especially interiorly, for the share in the divinity of Jesus given to us with his Birth. Perhaps you might consider coming to daily Mass also during the weeks of Advent. Also, opportunities for the Sacrament of Confession will be significantly increased during Advent here at the Cathedral Parish and this information will be in next Sunday's parish bulletin. The Advent Wreath will be blessed at the Anticipated Mass for the First Sunday of Advent. Information on our Advent Giving Tree will also be in next week's bulletin. Advent passes so quickly, and more so if we don't give it some serious thought beforehand.

#### A King Like No Other

We have not elected God as president. There are no referendums on God's will, and no chance of recall votes. God as King seems strange in our democratic, individualistic society. Jesus experienced oppressive rulers-think of Herod and Pontius Pilate-but he connected his kingly status to humble service, and instructed his followers to be servants. He humbled himself, became human, suffered, and died for us. The Lord of glory hung on a cross of shame to free us from the bondage of sin and death. He is Lord, King, and Judge, but his justice is intended to lead to our repentance and ultimate salvation. We believe "he will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end." The scriptures say that God delays Christ's return so we all have time to repent. Christ our King offers us true freedom as the beloved children of God.
