

My mouth will tell of your righteous acts, of your deeds of salvation all day long.


All day long my tongue will talk of your righteous help,



I trust in the Lord; my sould trust in his word. More than sentinels wait for the dawn, let israel wait for the Lord.



For there is mercy with thee: therefore shalt thou be feared.


I look to the Lord; my soul doth wait for him, and in his word is my trust.






