Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow, December 8th, is the Holy Day of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary, under this title, is the patroness of the United States of America. This December Holy Day of Obligation reminds all of us that Mary is a figure for Advent. Mary was conceived without any stain of sin to be the Mother of our divine Savior. We come to her as we observe Advent—especially with prayer and penance—that we may have a genuine experience of the Lord coming into our hearts and lives. The Mass schedule for this Holy Day can be found elsewhere in the Parish Bulletin.

In addition to our Blessed Mother as a sign of Advent Time, the Church proposes another sign for us to consider. The Prophet Isaiah is this sign. In a remarkable way this Prophet announces the coming of the Lord that the Church considers all throughout the four weeks of Advent—the coming of the Lord at the end of time and of our lives, the coming of the Lord in his Birth in history, and the coming of the Lord now in our lives. At the same time the Prophet announces the coming of the Lord, he exhorts us to prepare for this coming with the reform of our ways according the ways of the Lord. The Liturgy of the Word of Mass all through Advent makes use of the Prophet Isaiah to make ready the Church, each of us, for the coming of the Lord. I suggest during the days of Advent, in the midst of the rush of this pre-Christmas period, that you find some precious time each day to read reflectively the Prophet Isaiah in your home. This reading could then be followed by some meditative prayer on your own desire to be more prepared for the many comings of the Lord commemorated this Advent.

This Sunday, our second collection is for the *Retirement Fund for Religious*. I thank you for your generosity to this collection. Let us also pray especially for all the retired religious, especially our Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Cathedral Parish, who have served us so faithfully for so many years.

WORDS FROM POPE FRANCIS......

Reflecting on the words of any Pope helps us to grow in our faith—after all, he is our shepherd, the one who calls us on as one body in Christ. We will offer short excerpts taken from Pope Francis' addresses and homilies which will reflect the themes that we can expect to hear again and again during his pontificate.....

The Beatitude of Faith

Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and God!" (John 20:28). So Jesus said, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believed" (20:29); and who were those who believed without seeing? Other disciples, other men and women of Jerusalem who, on the testimony of the apostles and the women, believed even though they had not met the Risen Jesus. This is a very important word about faith; we can call it the beatitude of faith. Blessed are those who have not seen but have believed: this is the beatitude of faith! In every epoch and in every place, blessed are those who, on the strength of the word of God proclaimed in the Church and witnessed by Christians, believe that Jesus Christ is the love of God incarnate, Mercy incarnate. And this applies to each one of you!

Living Stewardship Now THE SOUND OF STILLNESS

Can you hear him above the busyness and noise? John the Baptist says we must change. A great light will expose our sinfulness and burn up what we cannot hide. We cannot be complacent. We must change, but how? Centuries ago a young man grew up in northern Africa. He received an excellent education, but fell in with a sect called the Manichees, who encouraged evil living. He prayed to God to change him, "but not yet." Finally. he faced his own emptiness and powerlessness and was quiet enough to hear the "still small voice." God said, "Take up and read." The scriptures fell open to the Letter to the Romans (13:13-14). His heart changed. His name is Augustine—a bishop, great Christian theologian, and doctor of the Church. Advent is a time to quiet down and listen so we don't miss the personal message that God has for us.
