Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, we light the rose colored candle on the Advent Wreath. This candle takes it color from the Mass vestments which may also be rose this Sunday. The purple of Advent is muted with the rose of this Sunday to announce the nearness of the celebration of the Birth of the Lord. The anticipation and penance of Advent becomes a cry of rejoicing today with Christmas in sight. The nearness of Christmas also reminds us that our preparation continues and perhaps must be more intense.

As you most likely have noticed in the Christmas mailing to your homes and in the Parish Bulletin, we have increased the opportunities for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation here at the Cathedral, especially the week before Christmas. In the rush of these pre-Christmas days our planning to make a good Christmas Confession can all too easily be put aside. I encourage you to plan this week when you will meet the Lord in his Sacrament of mercy and forgiveness. We have many senior parishioners who live alone and have difficulty getting to church during the week. I invite you to consider offering a senior neighbor a ride to church so that he or she may also have the blessing of a good Christmas Confession.

Over the next several days we will begin to arrange the Nativity scene in the sanctuary of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary with the Holy Family arriving on Christmas Eve. The handsome *Kostner* Nativity Set was purchased by the Cathedral Parish for Christmas 2009 and we continue to make payments on it. Also, you may have noticed the much needed two new beautiful altar missal stands for the Basilica and the Chapel. If anyone would like to make a donation to the payment of the Nativity Set and/or a memorial donation for the altar missal stands, I would be most grateful.

Faith Is Linked to Hope

Suffering reminds us that faith's service to the common good is always one of hope—a hope which looks ever ahead in the knowledge that only from God, from the future which comes from the Risen Jesus, can our society find solid and lasting foundations. In this sense, faith is linked to hope, for even if our dwelling place here below is wasting away, we have an eternal dwelling place which God has already prepared in Christ, in his body (cf. 2 Corinthians 4:16-5:5)

A Gift That Demands Response

Faith is first of all a gift we have received. But in order to bear fruit, God's grace always demands our openness to him, our free and tangible response. Christ comes to bring us the mercy of a God who saves. We are asked to trust in him, to correspond to the gift of his love with a good life, made up of actions motivated by faith and love.

Living Stewardship Now I Can Wait

Today Saint James urges us to be patient, "because the coming of the Lord is at hand" (James 5:8). "Being patient" means enduring without complaint. The farmer must wait for the sun, rain, and good earth to do their work, while the farmer weeds, fertilizes, and keeps away pests. Thus it is in Advent: God is sending us a savior, but we must prepare for his coming. Yet children are born impatient. Everyone has seen toddlers "melt down" when they have to wait. Advent is four weeks—a long time for children. Many families use Advent calendars and Bible stories to focus their children on the unfolding of this season. They go to Advent penance services and choose gifts for people named on the parish giving tree. They light the Advent wreath before meals and pray together. The time a family spends savoring God's good time helps children see the importance of waiting, watching, and learning.
