Dear Parishioners,

The Synod of Bishops in Rome receives a great deal of attention in the media. This type of meeting of representative Bishops from around the world with the Holy Father has taken place many times since the 1965 close of the Second Vatican Council. The recent popes, now including Pope Francis, have made use of these meetings to reflect on topics and themes central to the life of the Church. A Synod is often followed by an exhortation by the Holy Father to the whole Church to consider anew the proposals, reflections and conclusions from the meeting. The current Synod which runs for the month of October examines a contemporary topic and with ramifications for the pastoral outreach of the Church: *The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and Contemporary World*.

On the one hand, the Gospel and the traditional teaching of the Church on Christian marriage and the family are consistent and clear. On the other hand, the culture and, in fact, the circumstances of life for many Catholics are at odds with the Gospel and Church teaching on these topics. So, how do we bridge the gap? How do we maintain the received doctrine of the Christ and his Church and also bring together people who are at odds with this doctrine in thought and life style? This is part of the subject matter of the Synod. The Church has a duty to promote and protect the sanctity of marriage and family life. The Church also has a duty to include all those who belong to her and lead them to the truth of Christ. This is her outreach. As the Synod Fathers meet in Rome, including our own Archbishop Chaput, let us keep the Holy Father and the Bishops in our prayers. Let us also pray for the openness and courage to be more committed to the Gospel values of marriage and family and in the service of those who find themselves at a distance from these values.

This past Sunday our Cathedral Parish Choir sang two Sunday Masses, the 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass and the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass. It is a joy to have the choir once again assisting us at Sunday Mass after the break of the summer. Mr. Brandon Motz is the interim Cathedral Parish Music Director. I am very grateful to Brandon and those assisting him as we make preparations to search for a replacement for Dr. John Romeri.

> October is the Month of the Holy Rosary. Consider praying the Rosary each day of this month.

CAMELS AND NEEDLES

Not long ago a group of professors at Boston College studied people in America who are "superrich," who have \$25 million or more. There are approximately 115,000 of them. Some were born into wealth, others made their wealth, while a few fell into sudden riches. You might think that having no money worries would simply make life a breeze, but you would be mistaken. Surprisingly, those who participated in the study revealed that wealth affects every aspect of their lives, and not always for the good. Marriage and friendship can be difficult ("Do they love me or love my money?"). Rich parents worry that their children will do nothing worthwhile with their lives. In ancient times the Jews believed that wealth was a sign of divine favor. To the early descendants of Abraham, wealth meant owning large flocks of sheep, goats, and cattle. By the time Jesus encountered the rich young man in today's Gospel, people acquired wealth by farming the land and through trade. Jesus challenged the man to give away his possessions-to free himself of the burden of wealth that was keeping him from the fullest possible life with God. Wealth in itself is not evil, but evil can result if we come to feel owned by our possessions. Modern Jewish teaching is not far from our own Christian understanding of wealth. The things of this world are important, but temporary. Wealth, whether in the form of skills, time, or money, is not an end but a means: a means to create a home; raise children; provide hospitality; to give time, attention, love, charity, and money; and to share with church and community for the well-being of all. Jesus promises that the one who gives up any possessions for his sake will be saved.
