Thank you so very much for your thoughtful and generous response to the priestly vocation program, *Called by Name*. Please see the information on this program in this edition of the Parish Bulletin. Next Sunday, the Cathedral Parish will participate in the Annual Seminary Collection. This collection, taken throughout the Archdiocese of Philadelphia at this time of the year, is one of the principal sources of income for the operation of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary. Seminarian Augustus DeSimone will be with us next Sunday to speak before each Mass about the Seminary. Your financial and prayerful support of the Seminary and its mission is greatly appreciated. This year more than twenty-five new seminarians from the Archdiocese entered Saint Charles.

You may recall, during the month of October there was the possibility for parishioners to be nominated for the Parish Pastoral Council. The Parish Pastoral Council, for the most part, is to be an elected body from among the parishioners to assist the Rector/Pastor with advice and consultation on the pastoral life of the parish. Elections are to take place each year. For one reason or another, there have not been elections to this Council for many years here at the Cathedral Parish. So, I had hoped to change this with the recent nominations. Unfortunately, there were insufficient nominations to allow for an election this year. So, I am going to accept the single nominations for the membership categories that were proposed for election. The Rector/Pastor is also charged to appoint certain members to the Council. After this month's Parish Pastoral Council Meeting, with new and current members, I will provide you with a complete roster of the Parish Pastoral Council membership. Additionally, the Parish Finance Council membership has remained the same for some years. Likewise, there will be new members appointed to the Parish Finance Council in time for their next meeting. I will also provide you with a complete roster of the Parish Finance Council membership after their winter meeting.

Please remember to pray, especially during this month of November, for the Holy Souls in Purgatory!

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to the support of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish in so many ways.

Amigos de los Trabajadores Agrícolas, una organización sin fines de lucro, ahora ofrece asistencia legal **gratuita** a las víctimas de fraude de servicios migratorios. El fraude de servicios migratorios sucede cuando alguien que no posee con licencia para ejercer la ley de inmigración cobra dinero para ayudarle con su solicitud de inmi-gración. Ellos pueden decir que son un asistente le-gal, especialista en inmigración, o tienen una conex-ión especial con los oficiales de inmigración, o pueden afirmar falsamente ser abogados, pero ninguna de esas personas pueden ejercer legalmente la ley de inmi-gración. Debido a que no tienen licencia, sus aplicaciones a menudo se les niegan e incluso pueden poner a las personas en peligro de deportación.

Living Stewardship Now

THE RIGHT AMOUNT

The account in today's Gospel should prompt us to take another look at the role of money in our lives as people of faith. Jesus and his disciples are in the temple. Jesus comments on the people putting cash offerings into the temple treasury, noting the well-dressed religious leaders who are offering large sums. These are the ones who parade around saying prayers out loud and accepting places of honor at banquets and in synagogues. "They devour the houses of widows," says Jesus to his disciples, "and will receive a very severe condemnation." At this point they see a poor widow approach, whose offering is equal to about two cents. Jesus praises her because she is giving all she has to live on, while the wealthy are giving only what they feel like sparing. But consider this story in another light. What if everyone could see exactly what you put in the parish offertory basket each and every week. How would you feel? Anxious, embarrassed, or even angry? Would you look at other people differently if you saw their contributions? Would you change your contribution? Would you give something every time instead of skipping some weeks? Or would your heart be at peace, knowing that your gift is a responsible decision reflecting your gratitude for all God's blessings? Jesus does not ask us to give so much that we cannot support ourselves: he condemns the temple scribes for letting the widow do that. Here is where the word "proportion" comes in. If, as followers of Jesus Christ, you see clearly that God is the giver of all, how do you offer thanks? What portion of these blessings do you give back to honor God and to build up the Church? Truly, everyone can give something; but the amount is between you and God.

Living Stewardship Now

A simple guideline for giving money each year:

- 1. Decide what portion of your income truly expresses your gratitude to God.
- 2. Of that total, set aside 50 percent to give to your parish in the offertory collection.
- 3. Give 10 percent of the total to your diocesan annual appeal.
- 3. Donate the other 40 percent to the charities and good causes you favor.
