Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow, January 18, 2016 begins the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This traditional week of prayer concludes on January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. Many of us know many people, often members of our own families, who are baptized Christians but not Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism-with water and the use of the Trinitarian formula given in Sacred Scripture—unites all Christians in the promises of Christ for salvation and redemption, with the grace to hear his word and be faithful to his way of life, and to have the hope for heaven. However, the unity Christ desires for all the baptized goes deeper and is more profound. It is a unity in truth as he also teaches us in Sacred Scripture. This is a unity that displaces confusion on moral issues among Christians and reaches its climax with an authentic and unambiguous understanding of the Holy Eucharist embraced by all Christians. This is the unity for which we pray during this week of prayer. Please make this one of your daily prayer intentions from January 18 through to January 25. Also, if possible, come to the Center City Ecumenical Service this Wednesday in the Cathedral Chapel. Additional information on this Service can be found elsewhere in the Parish Bulletin.

This Friday, January 22, 2016 is the Annual March for Life in Washington, DC. Thousands of marchers will attend from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, joining many more thousands from all around the country. The scourge of legalized abortion in the United States continues to call for all types of action on the part of Christians and citizens to bring it to an end and provide for the legal protection of human life from conception until natural death. Not everyone can go to Washington this Friday. But everyone can do something in favor of the sanctity of human life. Our United States Bishops ask Catholics throughout our country to observe January 22 as a day of prayer for the restoration of the protection of human life and penance for the violations against human life. Perhaps you might be able to attend Mass on Friday and/or pray the Holy Rosary for the restored protection of human life. Perhaps, you might fast from food in between meals or fast from the use of the internet as a penance for the violations against human life. We can all do something and, especially, we can be united in our prayer and penance, confident that the Lord in his mercy hears our prayers and will bless our good works.

Once again, we will have our *Sacrament Enrichment Program* over the next few weeks for our school age students who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Holy Communion here at the Cathedral Parish this Easter Time. Please contact the Parish Office, 215-561-1313, if your son or daughter is of the age for these Sacraments and is not already enrolled in an area Catholic School or Religious Education Program. Please make this contact as soon as possible.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be the US Bishops' National Collection for *Catholic Relief Services*. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish in so many ways.



Living Stewardship Now

SHARING A FEAST

One of the most fundamental ways that human beings offer love, respect, and compassion to one another is through the sharing of food and drink. Certainly, Jesus did that during the wedding feast at Cana. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus' love for us is most fully expressed when he feeds us with his own body and blood in the Eucharist. Jeannie, who lived in an affluent city suburb, offered her services as a nurse on a Catholic medical mission. The team travelled to a remote location in the hill country of eastern Haiti, setting up a temporary clinic next to the local church. For two weeks the volunteers worked long hours with limited supplies in a makeshift clinic serving hundreds of people with medical problems. As the day came for the clinic to close, the local people invited the medical team to a feast. Knowing the great poverty of the Haitian people, Jeannie wondered what would be served. As the food was placed before her, she was amazed at the variety and quantity—sweet potatoes, fried goat with hot sauce, fried plantains, bread, cornmeal porridge, beans and rice, and a special pineapple drink. "How," Jeannie asked the local pastor, "could the people manage to give us this good meal?" "Jeannie," he said, "they believe that God sent you all to us to bring healing, and this feast is their way of thanking God with the best they could find. They each gave a little so that we could all share a lot." Everyone, including the servers and the cooks, ate until it was all gone. Jeannie thought that no food had ever tasted so good to her. She went home with a profound respect for the generosity of people who "have nothing" but shared so much.

Living Stewardship Now

A good meal depends not on what is on the table but who is on the chairs. Try to eat at least one meal a day with family, friends, or fellow workers. Banish cell phones and TV.
