Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday kicks-off the Annual Catholic Charities Appeal in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. For 2016 there is A New Vision guiding the Catholic Charities Appeal. In addition to the traditional and vital work among the poorest and most disadvantaged, this year Catholic Charities is targeting virtually aspect of Catholic life for enrichment and improvement, including the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul. This year's goal for the Archdiocese is \$15 million dollars, a goal that is bigger and more ambitious than ever before, but one that so desperately needs to be reached. Our Cathedral Parish goal is \$44, 613.00. It is important that every parishioner do his or her part to help reach our parish goal and, in turn, help the Archdiocese to reach the overall goal for the Appeal. Mr. Timothy Navin and Mr. Blair Sturm, parishioners, are the Parish Coordinators for the Catholic Charities Appeal and will keep us posted on our participation as the Appeal progresses through the year. I thank you in advance for your interest and generosity in this most helpful financial campaign of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

In the United States, the World Day for Consecrated Lifefor all men and women Religious-is transferred from the universal date of February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, to this Sunday, February 7, 2016. The Sunday observance gives many more people the opportunity to pray together for Religious priests, Brothers and Sisters, those now active in the service of the Church and those who have died. Pope Saint John Paul II established this world day of prayer for Religious in 1997 and chose the Feast of the Presentation, the feast that highlights Jesus as the Light of the world, to remind Religious and all of us that those in the Consecrated Life, a life of chastity, poverty and obedience, are signs of Christ's Light among us. Today, please keep in your prayers the Religious, living and deceased, who have served the Cathedral Parish throughout the years and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, Sunday evening February 7, 2016, Archbishop Chaput, will commemorate this annual observance of the World Day for Consecrated Life at the 6:30 PM Mass. Religious from throughout the Archdiocese have been invited to attend.

Lent begins this Wednesday, February 10, 2016, with Ash Wednesday. Blessed Ashes will be distributed at all the Masses on Ash Wednesday, celebrated at 7:15 AM, 12:05 PM (Basilica), 12:35 PM, 5:15 PM (Basilica), and 7:00 PM in Spanish. The Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy invites us especially to make a good Lent with every effort to turn away from sin and be renewed in our faithfulness to the Gospel. Making a good Confession is an essential element of our Lenten journey to Easter. Please see the insert in this Parish Bulletin for the complete plan for parish opportunities to make a good Lent.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to the parish goal for the Catholic Charities Appeal. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish in so many ways.

# Living Stewardship Now

# I'LL DO IT

Chances are you've heard this one before, but it bears repeating. "This is a story about four people named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody, and Nobody. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was asked to do it. Everybody was sure Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it, but Nobody did it. Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody's job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it but Nobody realized that Everybody wouldn't do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what Anybody could have done." In the reading from Isaiah today, we hear about the prophet's call. He has a vision of God's holiness and majesty so overpowering that he becomes sharply aware of the great gulf between him and God and between God and God's people. Yet the angel touches Isaiah's lips with the burning coal and says "[Y]our wickedness is removed, your sin is purged." And when the voice of the Lord says, "Who will go for us?" Isaiah immediately replies, "Here I am; send me!" (Isaiah 6:7, 8, 9). Isaiah doesn't look around for someone else to do the job. He doesn't make excuses. He doesn't ask for time to think things over. Nor does he ask what will be required of him. This is a trust with no strings attached, a willingness to do God's will wherever that may lead. Simon Peter and the other fishermen in today's Gospel have caught nothing, but Jesus tells them to let down their nets in deep water, and the catch is so huge that it takes all hands to haul it aboard. Like Isaiah, Simon Peter is only conscious of his own sinfulness. Jesus tells him not to be afraid, and all at once the whole crew join Simon and leave everything to follow wherever Jesus will lead them.
