# Dear friends,

On Ash Wednesday, all of us were invited in a renewed way to "repent and believe in the Gospel." With those familiar words, the minister who imposed ashes on our foreheads reminded us of our own mortality and the need to constantly examine our consciences so as to accept the Lord's merciful invitation to be reconciled to His Father and our Father.

The days of our Lenten observances are quickly coming to their close. Each of us should be asking ourselves whether this lent has been effective. Perhaps we have taken on penances — some commitment to prayer, fasting or almsgiving — and perhaps we have been faithful to such things. Or, it may be more likely that we have struggled with our penances, forgetting about them or neglecting them from time to time. Maybe we've not yet done *anything* to enter, in an intentional way, into the spirit of this holy penitential season.

Well, friends, regardless of where we are at, there is good news! As long as we're breathing, there is still time to "repent and believe in the Gospel."

The mercy of God is so very generous indeed! He constantly places before us many and varied paths that lead us again to His loving embrace. However, He will never force us to accept His mercy. We must be willing. We must turn to Him. That is what repentance is all about. This is the meaning of conversion. Turning again to the Lord, we approach with all our wounds caused by the trauma of sin. It is only by showing all our wounds to the Divine Physician that He can give us the even-more-powerful medicine of His grace. Will you let Him?


Allow me to be more direct. For those of us among the baptized, the Lord has given the sure remedy for sin; we must humbly confess our sins to Christ the Priest in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. In this Sacrament of mercy, through the ministry of His priests, the Lord Himself absolves us of our sins, no matter how heinous, no matter how long it has been, no matter how ashamed we might be. He speaks to each of our hearts, "Do not be afraid!"

Friends, now is the time to turn to the Lord and receive the merciful forgiveness He longs to share with us. I pray that we will all take the time to prepare for Easter in this most excellent way.

May God, the Father of all mercies, bless us all!

# Double Standards

The philosopher Bertrand Russell, who prided himself on his atheism, once spoke of two kinds of morality that seem to exist in contemporary life—one that we preach but fail to practice, and another that we do practice but hardly ever preach. Jesus, by contrast, never allowed such double thinking. In today's Gospel, the crowd publicly humiliates the woman caught in adultery and is ready to stone her to death. Stoning was prescribed in many ancient cultures, mostly for sexual and religious sins. Jesus takes another track entirely. He does not question the woman's guilt, but rather exposes the hidden guilt in the hearts of the people who were so ready to harm her. Not only were they ashamed of themselves, they could no longer look down on the woman as "the guilty one" from their position of supposed superiority. We may never be tempted to do actual violence to another person, but the question we have to ask is whom do we sit in judgment on? A family member who is an alcoholic? A woman who has had an abortion? An immigrant who may be here illegally? Or worse yet, do we condemn in our hearts whole groups of people: another race, another religion, another political party, a different income bracket? Are we sure that everyone who has committed a crime deserves punishment? Most of us can keep our own sins hidden away, but they follow us like a dark shadow, doing all kinds of damage to us, to our relationships, and to our dealings with the world around us. There are two things that we can do: unload all our guilt and sense of disapproval on God in confession, and then make a serious effort to understand how much more we are like other people than different from them. That will lighten us up.
