Dear Parishioners,

Plans are underway for our Keys and Sword Event 2018. As many of you know our Keys and Sword Event 2017 was tremendously successful and this was in large part due to the enthusiastic support of our parishioners. The Keys and Sword Event is the principal fund raiser of the Cathedral Parish. It takes place in conjunction with our patronal feast each June, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. The funds raised by the event are directed to projects and ministries of the Parish that are not included in the budget of the general operational fund. The event can be supported in three ways: through a general donation, the purchase of ad for the Ad Book, and the purchase of tables and/or tickets for the dinner. This year the dinner will take place on the feast day itself, June 29, 2018. Last year, ten percent of the net income was given to the Saint Francis Inn in Philadelphia. This year, ten percent of the netted income will go to the Sacred Heart Free Cancer Home in Philadelphia. It is important for us to share our blessings.

Parishioners, I invite you once again to be a part of the success of our Keys and Sword Event 2018. Take time to read the insert in the Parish Bulletin which lists the many ways that you can participate. If you know of someone who might want to support the Parish with a donation or an ad, please give them a copy of the insert or direct them to the Cathedral Parish website for more information. It is not too early to buy tickets to the event itself. Last year our goal was to have 250 people at the dinner and raise two hundred thousand dollars. We almost met our goal! This year our goal is to have 300 people at the dinner and raise three hundred thousand dollars. We can do it, especially working together!

As the Cathedral Parish begins its own fundraising efforts to provide for its important needs, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia begins its annual Catholic Charities Appeal next weekend. This is the 60th year for the annual appeal with the theme—60 Years of Giving Hope to All. You will find informational brochures in the pews next weekend on the Catholic Charities to complement what you receive in the mail. I ask you now to consider your own contribution to the Catholic Charities Appeal. Our Parish Goal is \$49, 075. Thank you so very much your continued generosity to this appeal.

On Friday, February 2, 2018, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. A part of this celebration is the blessing of candles used for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. This blessing will take place at the 12:05 PM Mass in the Cathedral Chapel. Additionally, the Feast of the Presentation is the day when the Church prays in a special way for all those in the Consecrated Life. Let us remember, all the many religious priests, brothers and sisters who are a part of our lives. We remember especially Father Eduardo de la Torre, LC, who celebrates our weekly Sunday Mass in Spanish, and Sister Eleanor McCann, RSM, a member of our parish staff, and thank the Lord for their religious vocations.

On Saturday, February 3, 2018, the Church celebrates the Memorial of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. In conjunction with the Memorial we have the Blessing of Throats for individuals at the 12:05 PM Mass in the Cathedral Chapel and in a general way at the 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed toward the Annual Catholic Charities Appeal. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish in so many ways.

¿CON QUÉ AUTORIDAD?

Un hombre llega a la puerta de tu casa con una Biblia en la mano:

"Buenos días. ¿Pudiera compartir unas palabras de la verdad cristiana con usted?"

"Por supuesto. ¿De dónde saca usted esa verdad?" respondes tú.

"De la Biblia, por supuesto".

"¿Es ésa su autoridad? ¿La Biblia?"

"Sí, es la única autoridad para los cristianos".

"¿Puede usted probar eso con la Biblia?"

Para nosotros las Escrituras son un puente para llegar a la verdad de Dios, pero también lo son los sacramentos y la experiencia de la Iglesia vivida a través de todas las generaciones, o sea, lo que llamamos la Tradición. Parte de nuestra responsabilidad como discípulos de Jesús es aprender de las Escrituras, esto es, escuchar atentamente durante la Misa, leer las Escrituras en una actitud orante, y aprender más acerca de la Biblia mediante la lectura, y el estudio individual y grupal.

WHO'S AUTHORITY?

A man stands on your front doorstep, holding a Bible: "Good afternoon. May I share a few words of Christian truth with you?"

"Sure. Where do you get this truth?"

"From the Bible, of course."

"That's your authority? The Bible?"

"Yes, it's the only authority for Christians."

"Can you prove that from the Bible?"

"What do you mean?"

"I mean I don't believe the Bible claims to be the sole rule of faith. Please show me where the Bible claims such a status for itself."

Sometimes the conversation goes more like this:

"Good afternoon. May I share a few words of Christian truth with you?"

"No. I'm a Catholic."

The door closes.

Many door-to-door proselytizers have good intentions. They want to convert you to the "truth"—as they see it. From their perspective, the Bible is the sole authority for the Christian faith. Some are taught that Catholics are prohibited from reading the Bible or know nothing about the scriptures. However, not only do we have full access to the Bible, but we hear segments of it proclaimed every time we celebrate Mass. In today's first reading God gives Moses the right to speak with divine authority to the people of Israel. In today's readings Jesus and Moses are recognized as speaking and acting with the authority of God. Both Jesus and Moses acted as a bridge between the people and God. For us the scriptures are a bridge for God's truth, but so are the sacraments and the lived experience of the Churchwhat we call Tradition. It is part of our responsibility as disciples of Jesus to learn from the scriptures, to listen attentively at Mass, to read scripture prayerfully for ourselves, and to learn more about the Bible through reading, studying, and learning with others.
