Dear Parishioners,

This is the First Sunday of Lent. Everything about Lent, for every member of the Church, is the task of turning away from sin and embracing a Christian life that is even more faithful to the word and ways of Jesus. This is a year round task and not an easy one. Lent gives us the opportunity—as we are inspired by those elected for Baptism at Easter—to root out those things in our lives that are truly obstacles to living fully the Gospel. Lent is a time to be seriously engaged in a period of enlightenment by Christ's word and purification from our sins. I encourage you to make a good Lent! Traditionally, the Holy Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent describes the temptations of Jesus by the devil in the desert. Jesus, the divine Son, gives us an example in the way he confronts the devil to overcome temptation. Jesus, the divine Son, is our power and strength to fight temptation in our lives. He constantly offers us his mercy to heal and restore us as his followers. With the strength and the mercy of the Lord with us, we cannot help but make a good Lent.

A good Confession is part of a good Lent. Here at the Cathedral Parish there are countless opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Confessions are heard three times on Sundays—at 9:00 AM, 10:30 AM and 5:30 PM, once on Saturdays—at 4:15 PM, and each weekday at 11:30 AM. Confession is the staple of the Christian life and should be a part of our year round practice of the Faith. However, a Lenten Confession gives us the opportunity to face more fully our need for deeper conversion from sin and new life in the Lord. Please encourage the members of your family to join you in making a good Lenten Confession. Also, please reach out to the elderly and homebound with the offer to bring them to Confession.

In addition to a good Confession, the Church invites all of us to look for ways to give alms, to pray and to fast in a more profound and consistent manner. Please consider making use of the Rice Bowls found at the entrances to the church. The money we do not spend on food goes to help the poor in many parts of the world. Consider extra time in prayer in your home, especially in the morning and the evening. Pray the psalms during Lent. Consider fasting everyday of Lent. Fasting is certainly penitential but also opens the door for God and his grace to be at work in us. A personal plan of almsgiving, praying and fasting helps to make for a fruitful Lent.

The Feast of Saint Katharine Drexel is this Tuesday, March 3, 2020. We have two special observances for the feast day here at the Cathedral Basilica and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel. The 12:05 PM Mass will be a sung Mass in the Basilica for the Feast. At 7:00 PM, there will be an Evening of Song and Prayer in honor of Saint Katharine Drexel. All are welcome to both observances. Parking is available for the 7:00 PM celebration in the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center parking lot.

Next Sunday, the second collection will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Basilica. If possible, please make use of the on-line possibility of making your weekly offering. Thank you so very much for all your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish and the Catholic Charities Appeal.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el primer domingo de Cuaresma. Todo acerca de la Cuaresma, para cada miembro de la Iglesia, es la tarea de alejarse del pecado y abrazar una vida cristiana que sea aún más fiel a la palabra y los caminos de Jesús. Esta es una tarea anual y no es fácil. La Cuaresma nos brinda la oportunidad, ya que nos sentimos inspirados por los elegidos para el Bautismo en Pascua, para erradicar esas cosas en nuestras vidas que son realmente obstáculos para vivir plenamente el Evangelio. La Cuaresma es un tiempo para comprometerse seriamente en un período de iluminación por la palabra de Cristo y la purificación de nuestros pecados. ¡Los animo a hacer una buena Cuaresma! Tradicionalmente, el Santo Evangelio para el primer domingo de Cuaresma describe las tentaciones de Jesús por el diablo en el desierto. Jesús, el Hijo divino, nos da un ejemplo en la forma en que confronta al diablo para vencer la tentación. Jesús, el Hijo divino, es nuestro poder y fortaleza para combatir la tentación en nuestras vidas. Él constantemente nos ofrece su misericordia para sanarnos y restaurarnos como sus seguidores. Con la fuerza y la misericordia del Señor con nosotros, no podemos evitar hacer una buena Cuaresma.

Una buena confesión es parte de una buena cuaresma. Aquí en la Parroquia de la Catedral hay innumerables oportunidades para recibir el Sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación. Las confesiones se escuchan tres veces los domingos, a las 9:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m. y 5:30 p.m., una vez los sábados, a las 4:15 p.m., y cada día de la semana a las 11:30 a.m. La confesión es el elemento básico de la vida cristiana y debe ser parte de nuestra práctica de la fe durante todo el año. Sin embargo, una Confesión Cuaresmal nos da la oportunidad de enfrentar más plenamente nuestra necesidad de una conversión más profunda del pecado y una nueva vida en el Señor. Anime a los miembros de su familia a unirse a usted para hacer una buena confesión cuaresmal. Además, comuníquese con los ancianos y confinados en su hogar con la oferta de llevarlos a la confesión.

Además de una buena confesión, la Iglesia nos invita a todos a buscar formas de dar limosna, rezar y ayunar de una manera más profunda y consistente. Considere hacer uso de los platos de arroz (Rice Bowl, por sus siglas en inglés) que se encuentran en las entradas a la iglesia. El dinero que no gastamos en alimentos se destina a ayudar a los pobres en muchas partes del mundo. Considere tiempo extra en oración en su hogar, especialmente en la mañana y en la noche. Ora los salmos durante la Cuaresma. Considere ayunar todos los días de Cuaresma. El ayuno es ciertamente penitencial, pero también abre la puerta para que Dios y su gracia trabajen en nosotros. Un plan personal de limosna, oración y ayuno ayuda a hacer una Cuaresma fructífera.

La fiesta de Santa Katharine Drexel es este martes 3 de marzo de 2020. Tenemos dos celebraciones especiales para el día de la fiesta aquí en la Basílica de la Catedral y el Santuario de Santa Katharine Drexel. La misa de las 12:05 PM será una misa cantada en la basílica para la fiesta. A las 7:00 PM, habrá una Noche de Canto y Oración en honor a Santa Katharine Drexel. Todos son bienvenidos a ambas celebraciones. El estacionamiento está disponible para la celebración de las 7:00 PM en el estacionamiento del Centro Pastoral Arquidiocesano.
