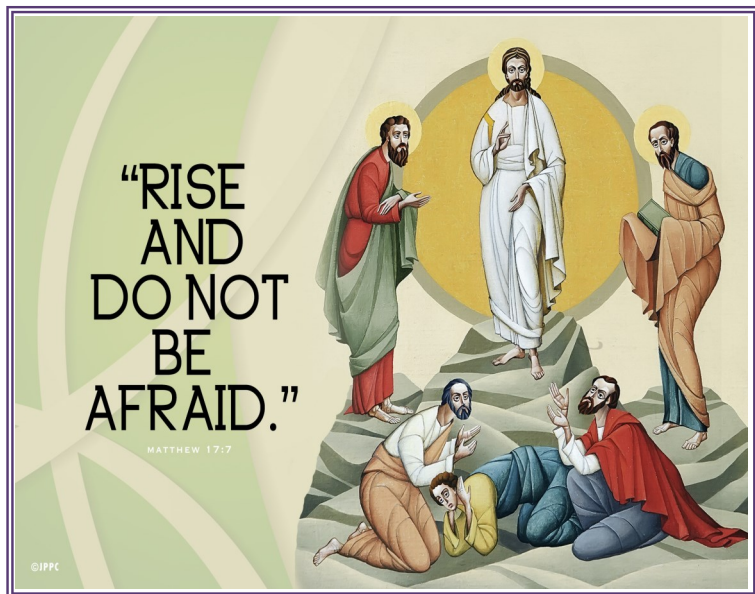

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Second Sunday of Lent! The traditional Gospel for this Sunday of Lent is the Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus appears on the mountain as if he is in the glory of heaven. This manifestation of Jesus to his apostles encourages them to persevere in following him, following him even though he has predicted his death to them. As we continue on our Lenten journey of conversion, of repenting of our sins and seeking a greater fidelity to the Gospel, we need the same encouragement given with the Transfiguration to the Lord’s apostles. The apostles and disciples of Christ gave themselves over completely to him and believed he was the Savior. Yet, we know from reading the Gospels that these same apostles and disciples met with difficulties in following their Lord and imitating his ways. His predicted suffering and death was a sure indication that they too would suffer and die with him. He gives them a glimpse of the promise of glory that will come to them because of their faith and fidelity. Likewise, today, as modern day followers of our Lord, we know the struggle—both interiorly and exteriorly—to be disciples of Christ and imitate him. The same transfigured Lord gives us the glimpse of Easter, of a share in his glory, to keep us on the path of Lent, of conversion and greater faithfulness, to become more intentionally his disciples. The Second Sunday of Lent is also the Sunday of Lent to pray for the already baptized candidates for the Easter Sacraments that they too will persevere in their own preparation with a good Lent. Let us all continue to listen to the Lord these Lenten days with his word and in our prayer so that we may not become faint in our own fidelity to him and to help encourage one another.

A small group among us gives additional meaning to the way we observe Lent. This group is our parish Elect. These two men—Jeff and John—were *elected* for the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist by Archbishop Pérez this past First Sunday of Lent. *Election* means that they have completed a period of catechetical formation for the reception of the Sacraments. They know what the Christian life is about and have a better understanding of the Sacraments. Now, they enter a period of purification and enlightenment with Lent to be prepared spiritually to be fully initiated with the Easter Sacraments at the Solemn Paschal Vigil on Easter night. As they prepare to be baptized they inspire those of us already baptized to be renewed in our baptismal integrity, to live as Christ intends for us, repenting of sin and following after him according to this word. On the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent, the *Elect* participate in the *Scrutinies*. These are penitential rites to help them uncover in themselves what still needs to be healed so they are free from any impediment to Baptism. These *Scrutinies* will take place at the 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass. The *Elect* pass through the *Scrutinies* to prepare for Easter. The baptized encounter the forgiveness of Christ in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation to prepare for Easter. The First Scrutiny will take place at the Anticipated Mass next Saturday evening, March 14, 2020. Please pray for our Elect.

Next Sunday, the second collection will be directed to the national collection for the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Latin America. If possible, please make use of the on-line possibility of making your weekly offering. Thank you so very much for all your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish and the Catholic Charities Appeal.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

¡Este es el segundo domingo de Cuaresma! El Evangelio tradicional para este domingo de Cuaresma es la Transfiguración del Señor. Jesús aparece en la montaña como si estuviera en la gloria del cielo. Esta manifestación de Jesús a sus apóstoles los alienta a perseverar en seguirlo, siguiéndole a pesar de que él les ha predicho su muerte. A medida que continuamos en nuestro viaje de conversión cuaresmal, de arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados y buscar una mayor fidelidad al Evangelio, necesitamos el mismo estímulo dado con la Transfiguración a los apóstoles del Señor. Los apóstoles y discípulos de Cristo se entregaron completamente a él y creyeron que él era el Salvador. Sin embargo, sabemos al leer los Evangelios que estos mismos apóstoles y discípulos tuvieron dificultades para seguir al Señor e imitar sus caminos. Su predicción de sufrimiento y muerte era una indicación segura de que ellos también sufrirían y morirían con él. Les da una idea de la promesa de gloria que les llegará por su fe y fidelidad. Del mismo modo, hoy, como seguidores modernos de nuestro Señor, conocemos la lucha, tanto interior como exteriormente, por ser discípulos de Cristo e imitarlo. El mismo Señor transfigurado nos da un vistazo de la Pascua, de una parte de su gloria, para mantenernos en el camino de la Cuaresma, de la conversión y una mayor fidelidad, para convertirnos más intencionalmente en sus discípulos. El segundo domingo de Cuaresma es también el domingo de Cuaresma para orar por los candidatos ya bautizados para los sacramentos de Pascua que ellos también perseverarán en su propia preparación con una buena Cuaresma. Sigamos escuchando al Señor estos días de Cuaresma con su palabra y en nuestra oración para que no podamos desmayarnos en nuestra propia fidelidad a él y para ayudarnos a animarnos unos a otros.

Un pequeño grupo entre nosotros le da un significado adicional a la forma en que observamos la Cuaresma. Este grupo es nuestra parroquia elegida. Estos dos hombres, Jeff y John, fueron elegidos para los Sacramentos de Pascua del Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía por el Arzobispo Pérez el pasado primer domingo de Cuaresma. Elección significa que han completado un período de formación catequética para la recepción de los sacramentos. Saben de qué se trata la vida cristiana y tienen una mejor comprensión de los sacramentos. Ahora, entran en un período de purificación e iluminación con la Cuaresma para prepararse espiritualmente para iniciarse plenamente con los Sacramentos de Pascua en la Solemne Vigilia Pascual en la noche de Pascua. Mientras se preparan para ser bautizados, inspiran a aquellos de nosotros ya bautizados a ser renovados en nuestra integridad bautismal, a vivir como Cristo se lo propone, arrepintiéndose del pecado y siguiéndolo según esta palabra. Los domingos tercero, cuarto y quinto de Cuaresma, los elegidos participan en los escrutinios. Estos son ritos penitenciales para ayudarlos a descubrir en sí mismos lo que aún necesita ser curado para que estén libres de cualquier impedimento para el Bautismo. Estos escrutinios se llevarán a cabo en la misa anticipada a las 5:15 pm. Los elegidos pasan por los escrutinios para prepararse para la Pascua. Los bautizados encuentran el perdón de Cristo en el Sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación para prepararse para la Pascua. El primer escrutinio tendrá lugar en la misa anticipada el próximo sábado por la noche, 14 de marzo de 2020. Oren por nuestros elegidos.

El próximo domingo, la segunda colecta estará dirigida a la Colección Nacional del Fondo de Solidaridad para la Iglesia en América Latina. Si es posible, utilice la posibilidad en línea de hacer su oferta semanal. Muchas gracias por toda su bondad y generosidad con la Parroquia de la Catedral y la Campaña de Caridades Católicas.

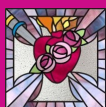
