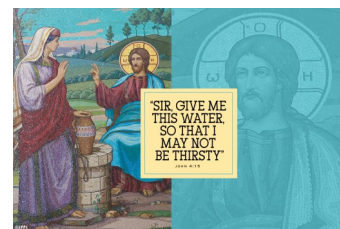

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Third Sunday of Lent! Lent is passing by quickly! Taking time to reread the Sunday Gospels of Lent keeps our focus on this holy time and its compelling call to turn away from sin and be more committed to the Gospel of Christ. Today, we hear the Gospel passage about the woman at the well (see John 4:5-52). This Gospel is directed especially to those adults among us who have been elected on the First Sunday of Lent for Baptism at the Easter Vigil. Through the conversation between the Lord and the Woman of Samaria, it slowly becomes clear to her that she is finally encountering the only One who can satisfy her real thirst, Jesus. This has been the journey of our catechumens/elect and also for everyone of us who has been baptized and are members of the Church. This Sunday reminds all of us of this truth and invites us to turn to Jesus more fully as the Savior. May we always and only thirst for the living water of salvation that come from Christ alone. May this thirst guide our deeper conversion during Lent.

The Coronavirus requires our responsible attention! Anxieties and fears are extremely high with the everyday news about the spread of the Coronavirus around the world and now locally. It is important that we listen to the health officials who are directing all of us to wash our hands with soap and water regularly and to avoid physical contact, especially handshakes. Another area of responsibility that we have as Christians is to pray, to pray for the quick end to the spread of the virus and to pray for all those infected and affected by the virus. In the midst of great anxiety and fear, like the present moment with the Coronavirus, it is possible to lose our focus on God and his nearness to us. The Scriptures remind us of God's intervening favor in the times of great trouble and distress for his people. The same is true throughout history and even in our recent history. Please make it part of your daily prayer to ask our heavenly Father to come to the aid of his people, near and far, during this trying period of the Coronavirus. Also, let us ask for the intercession of Our Lady, Health of the Sick, to bring the comfort of her Son to those who are suffering with the virus.

More parish sponsors are needed for the adults in our community seeking Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. We are already making plans for those adults who will prepare for the Easter Sacraments to be celebrated at the Easter Vigil 2021 and during Easter Time 2021. A very important dimension of their preparation is the example and interaction with someone who lives the Catholic Faith, a sponsor. A sponsor is expected to be with the catechumen or candidate throughout the period of preparation leading to the celebration of the Sacraments. For the most part, the relationship is informal. The testimony of the sponsor as to the readiness of the catechumen/candidate to receive the Sacraments is a critical part of his or her preparation. A sponsor is expected to be with the catechumen/candidate at the catechetical session each Thursday and frequently with him or her at Sunday Mass. Next Sunday, the second collection will be directed to the religious education programs in the Cathedral Parish. TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Exodus 17: 3-7

The lack of drinking water brings down on Moses the wrath of his people. After asking for His help, Moses obeys the Lord and strikes a rock with his staff. That in turn brings forth water aplenty and revives Moses' standing.

Reading II: Romans 5: 1-2, 5-8

Paul asserts that God's love is the blessed assurance of salvation for his brothers and sisters in the community. It is also his belief that "hope does not disappoint."

Gospel: John 4: 5-42

It was unheard of for a rabbi to speak in a familiar way with a woman in public, but even worse for a Jew to request water of a Samaritan. For Jesus, who does precisely both, He prefers to speak to the woman about "living water." By that He meant "divine vitality, revelation and wisdom."

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el tercer domingo de Cuaresma! ¡La Cuaresma pasa rápido! Tomarse el tiempo para releer los Evangelios dominicales de Cuaresma mantiene nuestro enfoque en este tiempo sagrado y su llamamiento convincente a alejarse del pecado y estar más comprometidos con el Evangelio de Cristo. Hoy, escuchamos el pasaje del Evangelio sobre la mujer en el pozo (ver Juan 4: 5-52). Este Evangelio está dirigido especialmente a aquellos adultos entre nosotros que fueron elegidos el primer domingo de Cuaresma para el bautismo en la Vigilia Pascual. A través de la conversación entre el Señor y la Mujer de Samaria, poco a poco se le hace claro que finalmente se encuentra con el Único que puede satisfacer su verdadera sed, Jesús. Este ha sido el viaje de nuestros catecúmenos / elegidos y también para todos los que hemos sido bautizados y somos miembros de la Iglesia. Este domingo nos recuerda a todos esta verdad y nos invita a volvernos a Jesús más plenamente como el Salvador. Que siempre y solo tengamos sed del agua viva de salvación que viene solo de Cristo. Que esta sed guíe nuestra conversión más profunda durante la Cuaresma.

¡El coronavirus requiere nuestra atención responsable! Las ansiedades y los temores son extremadamente altos con las noticias diarias sobre la propagación del Coronavirus en todo el mundo y ahora a nivel local. Es importante que escuchemos a los funcionarios de salud que nos indican que nos lavemos las manos con agua y jabón regularmente y que evitemos el contacto físico, especialmente los apretones de manos. Otra área de responsabilidad que tenemos como cristianos es rezar, rezar por el rápido fin de la propagación del virus y rezar por todos los infectados y afectados por el virus. En medio de una gran ansiedad y miedo, como el momento presente con el Coronavirus, es posible perder nuestro enfoque en Dios y su cercanía con nosotros. Las Escrituras nos recuerdan el favor que Dios interviene en los tiempos de grandes problemas y angustia para su pueblo. Lo mismo es cierto a lo largo de la historia e incluso en la propia historia reciente. Por favor, haga parte de su oración diaria para pedirle a nuestro Padre celestial que venga en ayuda de su pueblo, cerca y lejos, durante este período de prueba del Coronavirus. Además, solicitemos la intercesión de Nuestra Señora, Salud de los Enfermos, para llevar la comodidad de su Hijo a quienes sufren el virus.

Se espera que un patrocinador esté con el catecúmeno/candidato en la sesión catequética todos los jueves y con frecuencia con él o ella en la misa dominical.
