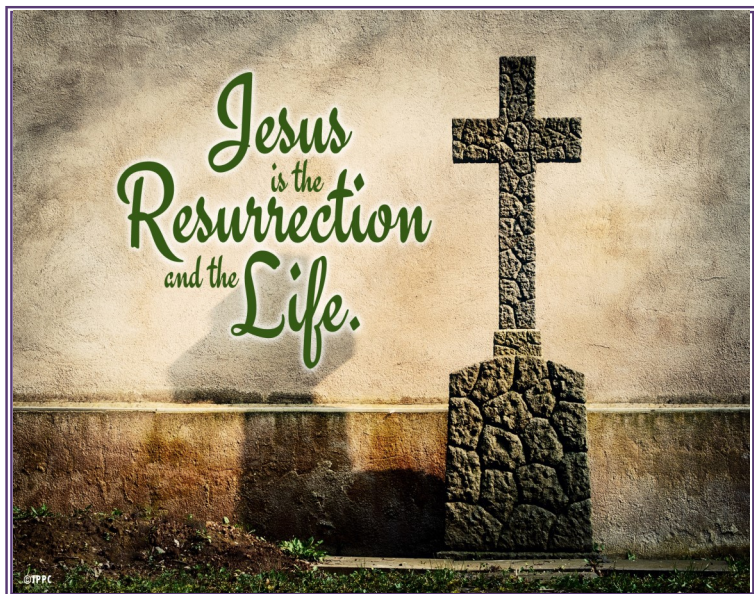

Dear Parishioners,

*I am so very much aware of you in my thoughts and prayers, even more so, during this pandemic of the Coronavirus. It has impacted all of us—and continues to do so with each passing day. My prayer runs in many directions. I pray for those who are sick and who have died, here and everywhere, for those suffering terrible financial burdens and with threats to their employment, as well as for the emotional and psychological stability of us all. Most of all, I pray that this may be a period for us to turn anew to God and become more dependent upon his provident love. Our Father is very near to us all the time as his loving children in his divine Son. He is especially near to us now. This past Wednesday, our Holy Father invited people of good will all throughout the world to pray the *Our Father* for all the intentions associated with the pandemic. Perhaps, we could make a commitment to do this every day. There is great spiritual strength in praying together the same prayer for the same intention. We have confidence that the Father of us all will truly "deliver us from evil!"*

The Cathedral Chapel is open every day from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM for prayer, especially for visits to the Most Blessed Sacrament. The "stay at home" directives allow people to go out for religious purposes. This is one reason why our churches are open. The Church is not fleeing from us during this time. The Church is with us, and especially so, at this time. Our open churches are powerful reminders during this moment of great uncertainty that the Lord and his Church is our refuge and our peace. Confessions are available Monday through Saturday at 11:30 AM in the Cathedral Chapel.

For some it is impossible to make it to church to receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation these days. This is understandable. Yet, there is the desire to receive this gift of the Lord's mercy during Lent in preparation for Easter. I want to remind you of the Church's teaching about Perfect Contrition.

Where the individual faithful find themselves in the painful impossibility of receiving sacramental absolution, it should be remembered that perfect contrition, coming from the love of God, beloved above all things, expressed by a sincere request for forgiveness (that which the penitent is at present able to express) and accompanied by votum confessionis, that is, by the firm resolution to have recourse, as soon as possible, to sacramental confession, obtains forgiveness of sins, even mortal ones (cf. CCC, no. 1452).

Thus, perfect contrition requires • the love of God • the sincere desire for forgiveness • the ardent commitment to receive the sacrament of reconciliation when available.

This is the Fifth Week of Lent. The Gospel for this Sunday (John 11: 1-45) tells the wonderful story of Lazarus brought back to life by Jesus. The Lord announces in this Gospel that he is the resurrection and the life. As we listen to or read this Gospel, may it lead us into a deeper spiritual preparation for Easter Sunday during these remaining days of Lent.

With no public Masses there are no collections. I encourage you to continue to support the Cathedral Parish. You can mail your Sunday offering to the Cathedral Parish Office or make use of the many ways to give electronically. Please see cathedralphila.org/donate/. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Estoy muy consciente de ustedes en mis pensamientos y oraciones, aún más, durante esta pandemia del Coronavirus. Nos ha impactado a todos, y continúa haciéndolo con cada día que pasa. Mi oración corre en muchas direcciones. Rezo por aquellos que están enfermos y que han muerto, aquí y en todas partes, por aquellos que sufren terribles cargas financieras y con amenazas a su empleo, así como por la estabilidad emocional y psicológica de todos nosotros. Sobre todo, oro para que este sea un período para que nos volvamos a Dios y nos volvamos más dependientes de su amor providente. Nuestro Padre está muy cerca de nosotros todo el tiempo como sus hijos amorosos en su Hijo divino. Él está especialmente cerca de nosotros ahora. El miércoles pasado, nuestro Santo Padre invitó a personas de buena voluntad en todo el mundo a rezar al Padre Nuestro por todas las intenciones asociadas con la pandemia. Tal vez, podríamos comprometernos a hacer esto todos los días. Hay una gran fuerza espiritual en rezar juntos la misma oración por la misma intención. ¡Confiamos en que el Padre de todos nosotros realmente nos "liberará del mal"!

La Capilla de la Catedral está abierta todos los días de 9:00 a.m. a 3:00 p.m. para la oración, especialmente para las visitas al Santísimo Sacramento. Las directivas de "quedarse en casa" permiten a las personas salir con fines religiosos. Esta es una razón por la cual nuestras iglesias están abiertas. La Iglesia no huye de nosotros durante este tiempo. La Iglesia está con nosotros, y especialmente en este momento. Nuestras iglesias abiertas son recordatorios poderosos durante este momento de gran incertidumbre de que el Señor y su Iglesia son nuestro refugio y nuestra paz. Las confesiones están disponibles de lunes a sábado a las 11:30 a.m. en la Capilla de la Catedral.

Para algunos es imposible llegar a la iglesia para recibir el Sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación en estos días. Esto es entendible. Sin embargo, existe el deseo de recibir este regalo de la misericordia del Señor durante la Cuaresma en preparación para la Pascua. Quiero recordarles la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre la Contribución Perfecta.

Cuando los fieles individuales se encuentran en la dolorosa imposibilidad de recibir la absolución sacramental, debe recordarse que la contrición perfecta, proveniente del amor de Dios, amada por encima de todas las cosas, expresada por una sincera solicitud de perdón (lo que el penitente es en la actualidad capaz de expresarse) y acompañado por votum confessionis, es decir, por la firme resolución de recurrir, lo antes posible, a la confesión sacramental, obtiene el perdón de los pecados, incluso los mortales (cf. CCC, no. 1452).

Por lo tanto, la contrición perfecta requiere • el amor de Dios • el sincero deseo de perdón • el ardiente compromiso de recibir el sacramento de la reconciliación cuando esté disponible.

Esta es la quinta semana de Cuaresma. El Evangelio para este domingo (Juan 11: 1-45) cuenta la maravillosa historia de Lázaro traído a la vida por Jesús. El Señor anuncia en este Evangelio que él es la resurrección y la vida. Mientras escuchamos o leemos este Evangelio, que nos lleve a una preparación espiritual más profunda para el Domingo de Pascua durante los días restantes de la Cuaresma.

Sin misas públicas no hay colecciones. Los animo a seguir apoyando a la Parroquia de la Catedral. 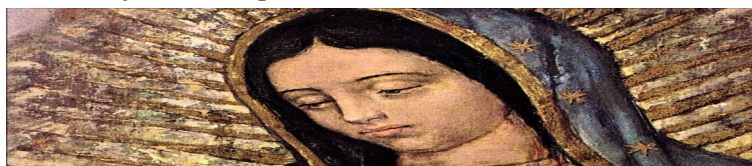
