

Dear Parishioners.

Today is Easter Sunday! Today we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead. Easter Sunday this year is like none other that we have ever celebrated. We are not able to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and receive Our Lord in Holy Communion. We are in our homes and not with extended family and friends. Even with all the precaution surrounding COVID-19 and the restrictions that have changed our lives for now, it is still very much Easter Sunday. Christ is truly risen from the dead and risen for us. Let us thank our Father in heaven who sent his only Son to us, to die for us and who raised us up with his Son from the tomb. The grace of the Risen Lord is abundant today as we read the Sacred Scriptures, make a Spiritual Communion and keep in mind his glorious triumph over sin and death. I encourage you to turn to our Risen Lord in your prayers today and for all of this Easter Time, trusting he lives within us and protects us from all harm.

This is the Collect for Easter Sunday Mass. Please add it to your prayers today.

O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Our parish catechumens/elect would have been fully initiated with the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist last evening at the Easter Vigil. Our parish adult candidates for the Easter Sacraments were looking forward to the celebration of their Confirmation and Eucharist during this Easter Time. The suspension of public Masses required a delay for the celebration of these Sacraments which will be rescheduled as soon as we are able to assemble again safely. Please keep our elect and candidates in your prayers. As soon as the new dates are established for their sacramental initiation, they will be published in the Parish Bulletin.

This Easter Week the Cathedral Chapel is open every day from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM for prayer. The "stay at home" directives allow people to go out for religious purposes. Confessions will be available Monday through Saturday at 11:30 AM in the Cathedral Chapel.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is the doorway to the Christian life and to all the other Sacraments. As such, preparation of the parents and for the

Baptism itself deserve very special attention. The celebration of Baptism at the Cathedral Parish takes place on the first Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM after the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass. Everyone is welcome.

The celebration will be carried out with liturgical music

and with a great sense of hospitality. **Upcoming Baptisms:** May 3rd, June 7th, July 5th, August 2nd, September 6th, October 4th, November 1st, and December 6th.

If you are registering your child for Baptism in May, June or possibly July, we may have to alter the dates, given the current situation. We will coordinate the dates with the convenience of our priests and with the families involved. Please call and register and we will work out the details together.

A Baptism Preparation Session takes place on the third Sunday of each month in anticipation of the celebration of the Sacrament. Parents in the Cathedral Parish are obligated to participate. The session is open to all of our neighbor parishes and to godparents as well. Parents are encouraged to participate during pregnancy, if at all possible.

Incluso con todas las precauciones que rodean a COVID-19 y las restricciones que han cambiado nuestras vidas por ahora, todavía es mucho domingo de Pascua. TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Acts 10: 34a; 37-43

Peter, in the house of Cornelius, acts as a missionary in preaching this sermon about his Lord Jesus. He presents the core message of Christianity: The risen Jesus is the One who is to judge the living and the dead with mercy.

Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4

Here is the foundation for the behavioral instructions that follow. Jesus now sits "at the right hand of God," which was an early Church expression naming Jesus as the promised messiah. Paul adds that believers "will appear with Him in glory."

The Gospel: Matthew 28: 1-10

Mary Magdalene reports to Peter and the Beloved Disciple (John?) of her pre-dawn discovery of the empty tomb. Out of his respect for Peter, the younger "Beloved Disciple" waits to enter the tomb until after the older man has. Both came to understand that Jesus "had to rise from the dead."



Following the example of Pope Francis, the supreme chaplain and I urge you to pray a <u>Novena for Protection in Time of Pandemic</u> during this difficult moment for our country and our world.

At important moments in the past, the Knights of Columbus has urged its members to pray. We did this at the outset of World War II, after 9/11, and during papal conclaves and civic elections. Today, the world faces a pandemic illness for the first time in a century. Having lost our founder, the Venerable Servant of God Father Michael McGivney, to a viral pandemic 130 years ago, we know such situations can be very serious.

We also know that prayer is an important expression of our trust in God and our relationship with him.

Saint John's Hospice is a Catholic Social Services shelter for men located in Center City Philadelphia. Established in 1963 by Monsignor Anthony J. O'Neill, Pastor of Saint John the Evangelist Church, and The Little Brothers of The Good Shepherd, Saint Johns was created as an outreach ministry to serve and assist the poor and homeless in the community. Saint John's continues to provide crucial, life-sustaining services with dignity, respect and compassion to homeless men in Philadelphia. Saint John's Hospice is an independent 501c3 agency associated with the charitable work of Catholic Social Services.

Programs: Residence for over 250 homeless men each year in St. John's Hospice & Good Shepperd programs; Case management, medical and counseling for all residents and day service guests; Mail Room for over 900 homeless men; 160 showers with clean clothing, underwear & shoes every week; Over 3,000 meals each week to homeless & needy men; Emergency shelter for 27 homeless men where they can receive a meal & bed every night.

HOSTS for HOSPITALS

The Basilica of Saints Peter & Paul, is reaching out to our community to help meet an urgent and growing need. At this time of the Coronavirus, a large number of patients with critical medical situations still must travel to town for non-elective, out-patient care: families with sick children; adult and pediatric oncology patients; pregnant moms with medical complications are among those who do not have a lodging option.

Most importantly, the Ronald McDonald Houses are no longer accepting new families, and the Hope Family Lodge for cancer patients will have closed by March 27, with 30-plus patients who were at this facility being forced to leave.

For 20 years the Greater Philadelphia non-profit HOSTS for HOSPITALS has provided lodging and support at volunteer Host-homes for patients and their families who travel here for specialized medical care. HOSTS for HOSPITALS now asks that anyone with a private, furnished lodging setting contact them to potentially help patient-families in need: homes, apartments, AirBnBs, in-law suites or other spaces that adhere to social distancing.
