



Today is also Mother's Day. Let us pray for all mothers, living and deceased, in thanksgiving for their irreplaceable role in our lives. This is also an occasion to encourage young mothers as they bravely carry out their duties to raise their children, especially in the ways of the Faith. Mother's Day is also another opportunity during this month of May, the month of Mary, to express our love for the Mother of our Savior and the Mother of us all. Let us continue to pray the Holy Rosary for our mothers and to honor the Blessed Mother.

TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Acts 6: 1-7

The widows of Greek-speaking Christian men (Hellenists) faced economic hardship and were being overlooked by the community. The Apostles were being swamped by requests and unable to answer them in a timely way. The Spirit directed them to commission seven men of proven virtue to do a "table ministry." Hence the diaconate was born.

Reading II: I Peter 2: 4-9

St. Peter describes Christians as those becoming "God's household" and sharing in the risen Lord's very life. He also describes the people using four Old Testament categories. Their basic task, he wrote, was to "announce the praises" of Jesus.

The Gospel: John 14: 1-12

St. Thomas, with his habitual honesty, questions Jesus about "the way." St. Phillip, in his bewilderment, asks to "see the Father." Jesus' astounding answer brings Phillip, and us too, the assurance that only faith does.

Letter from Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez Regarding the Parish Support Initiative.

Dear Brothers,

Please accept my deep gratitude for your ongoing dedication and service to provide for the pastoral and temporal needs of those entrusted to your care. As a former pastor, I understand the challenges you are facing in the course of your daily work are daunting and unprecedented right now. I'm also keenly aware of the pandemic's impact on parish finances.

Without public Mass, there have been no offertory collections for several weeks. While I have tasked Archdiocesan administrators and offices to do everything within their power to assist you, resources, especially financial ones, are very limited at the Archdiocesan level.

Recently, we partnered with The Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia (CFGP) to establish the Parish Support Initiative. Its purpose is *to help parish communities maintain sustainable giving levels throughout the pandemic*.

The Parish Support Initiative does not replace online giving that may already be in place at your parish. Rather, it represents an additional way for individuals to contribute to the parish of their choosing. By visiting <u>supportmyparish.org/...</u> individuals can make a one-time contribution or set up a recurring gift so that the parish of their choice receives a steady stream of operating revenue.

I've been sharing information about this program every week during the streaming broadcasts of Sunday Mass from the Cathedral. I highly encourage you to promote this initiative and/or your current online giving platforms broadly and often within your parish communities. In the current atmosphere, online giving is more important than ever to parish viability and sustainability.

TEN- A series reflecting on the Ten Plagues of Egypt! with Fr. Matt Guckin



Living Divine Mercy – (Pt. 3): The Corporal Works of Mercy

"Jesus, I trust in you!" Last week we considered what constitutes a "merciful outlook" and the manner in which it helps us to "see" opportunities for exercising mercy as they come. Particularly this will take shape in the practice of merciful deeds, words and prayers on behalf of others. Helpful to identifying and bringing to bear said deeds, words and prayers in our lives, the Church traditionally identifies several general ways that can serve as a guide for our merciful employments. These are the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. They are distinguished in this manner because we are not only souls with bodies. As men and women created in the image and likeness of God, our bodies and souls are intimately united.

Each of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of mercy has scriptural foundations. One of the most fundamental places we find connected the Works of Mercy and our service to Jesus Christ is in the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 25. There, we see the Son of Man coming in glory and power upon the clouds to separate the sheep from the goats ¹. What becomes apparent is that the criteria for those going to glory or perdition are the care which the members of each group exercised for Christ himself in "the least", that is: in the *hungry*, the *thirsty*, the *naked*, the *stranger*, the *ill*, the *imprisoned*.

From this place the Church identifies the several Corporal Works of Mercy adding to it regard we ought to have for those who have gone before us in faith as we bury the dead:

Corporal Works of Mercy

Feed the hungry
Give drink to the thirsty
Clothe the naked
Shelter the homeless
Visit the sick
Visit the imprisoned
Bury the dead

It is one thing to know what the several Corporal Works of Mercy. It is another to put them into action. The Works of Mercy identified in the Christian Tradition again, can serve as overarching guides to our endeavors. But do not limit our acts of mercy to the letter. What do I mean? For example, we are invited to feed the hungry, and our immediate response may be to donate to a food pantry or go work in a soup kitchen. Great goods!

A question worth considering, if everyone has the same idea, the soup kitchen will have a great deal of help but little to offer each volunteer by way of opportunity. How else might we exercise this work of mercy? A day-to-day application of feeding the hungry may involve keeping on hand bottled water or gift cards that may be made available to the hungry poor whom we come upon in our travels. It may similarly take the form of providing a meal or two for a family grieving the loss of a loved one.

Another of example of creativity may be found in the invitation to visit the imprisoned. This work may appear to be impossible in certain circumstances as today most prisoners are limited in who they may see during the course of the week. Chaplains at prisons can be of great assistance in connecting persons with the imprisoned; providing letters, books and more so that those who currently occupy a penitentiary may truly know "penitence" and turn to the Lord while there is still time to do so.

Manifest mostly in deeds and words, the Corporal Works of Mercy make plain the love of God in sometimes extraordinary ways. Next week we will consider the Spiritual Works of Mercy; no less extraordinary for their subtler employ.

HOSTS for HOSPITALS

The Basilica of Saints Peter & Paul, is reaching out to our community to help meet an urgent and growing need. At this time of the Coronavirus, a large number of patients with critical medical situations still must travel to town for non-elective, out-patient care: families with sick children; adult and pediatric oncology patients; pregnant moms with medical complications are among those who do not have a lodging option. Most importantly, the Ronald McDonald Houses are no longer accepting new families, and the Hope Family Lodge for cancer patients will have closed by March 27, with 30-plus patients who were at this facility being forced to leave. For 20 years the Greater Philadelphia non-profit HOSTS for HOSPITALS has provided lodging and support at volunteer Host-homes for patients and their families who travel here for specialized medical care. HOSTS for HOSPITALS now asks that anyone with a private, furnished lodging setting contact them to potentially help patient-families in need: homes, apartments, AirBnBs, in-law suites or other spaces that adhere to social distancing.
