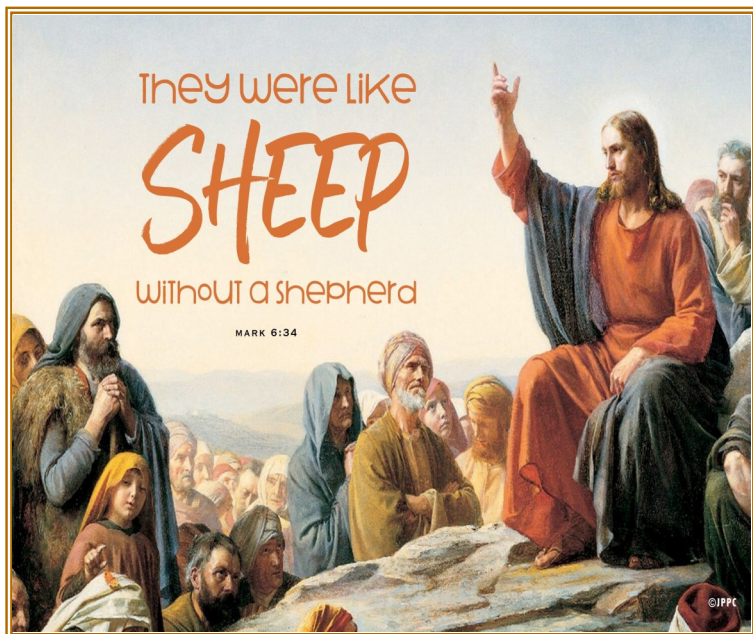

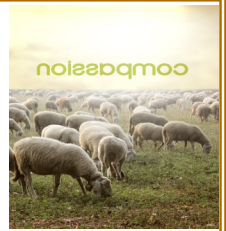

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The Gospel for this Sunday (Mark 6: 30-34) manifests the tender and constant love of Jesus for each of us. In the course of his public ministry, the Lord tirelessly gives himself over to his saving mission of teaching his followers and performing all types of healing. When he would see vast crowds before him, "his heart was moved with pity for them." Pity here is to be understood as compassion. The Lord suffered along with those in need. The Lord Jesus continues to suffer along with us in all our needs, especially as he continues to bring us his divine compassion in the announcement of his word and the celebration of his Sacraments through his Church. The Lord Jesus also continues to suffer along with us and comes to our aid when we reach out to one another in our need, when we listen to someone, pray with them and pray for them. All of us can be the face of the tender and loving Jesus before others as he is before each us. May today's Gospel inspire us to do so.

The violence in our City, especially the gun violence, is unspeakable. Oftentimes, the shootings are random. Lives are senselessly ended. Families and communities are devastated. And, violence frequently begets violence. Many times, we feel helpless in the face of such constant tragedy. One thing that we as Christians can do and must do is to pray. I propose that we pray the *Prayer of Peace*, perhaps making a novena for peace with this prayer. The prayer follows:

*Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy;*

*O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console;
to be understood as to understand;
to be loved as to love.*

*For it is in giving that we receive;
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.*

Join this prayer to your grace before or after meals or to the Holy Rosary or when you read the Sacred Scriptures. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Jeremiah 23: 1-6

The passage tells readers about the future king of Israel and Judah, who will be a "righteous shoot of David." The former kings were bad actors, and misleading shepherds of the people.

Reading II: Ephesians 2: 13-18

Jesus' blood has made Him the agent of peace between both Jews and Gentiles and the same between God and humanity. He has created one new person out of the two.

The Gospel: Mark 6: 30-34

This scene comes right before the feeding of the 5,000. The disciples participate in Christ's work; then we learn His followers are in "great numbers;" and finally of His compassion for the needy crowd.

REFLEXIÓN DEL RECTOR

Estimados feligreses,

¡Hoy es el Décimo-sexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario! El Evangelio de este domingo (Marcos 6: 30-34) manifiesta el amor tierno y constante de Jesús por cada uno de nosotros. En el curso de su ministerio público, el Señor se entrega incansablemente a su misión salvadora de enseñar a sus seguidores y realizar todo tipo de curaciones. Cuando veía grandes multitudes ante él, "su corazón se compadecía de ellos". La lástima aquí debe entenderse como compasión. El Señor sufrió junto con los necesitados. El Señor Jesús continúa sufriendo junto a nosotros en todas nuestras necesidades, especialmente mientras continúa llevándonos su divina compasión en el anuncio de su palabra y la celebración de sus sacramentos a través de su Iglesia. El Señor Jesús también continúa sufriendo junto con nosotros y viene en nuestra ayuda cuando nos acercamos unos a otros en nuestra necesidad, cuando escuchamos a alguien, oramos con ellos y oramos por ellos. Todos podemos ser el rostro del tierno y amoroso Jesús ante los demás como lo es ante cada uno de nosotros. Que el Evangelio de hoy nos inspire a hacerlo.

La violencia en nuestra Ciudad, especialmente la violencia con armas de fuego, es indescriptible. A menudo, los disparos son aleatorios. Las vidas se terminan sin sentido. Las familias y las comunidades están devastadas. Y la violencia con frecuencia engendra violencia. Muchas veces, nos sentimos impotentes ante una tragedia tan constante. Una cosa que nosotros, como cristianos, podemos y debemos hacer es orar. Propongo que recemos la *Oración de la Paz*, quizás haciendo una novena por la paz con esta oración. La oración siguiente:

*Señor, haz de mi un instrumento de tu paz.
Que allá donde hay odio, yo ponga el amor.
Que allá donde hay ofensa, yo ponga el perdón.
Que allá donde hay discordia, yo ponga la unión.
Que allá donde hay error, yo ponga la verdad.
Que allá donde hay duda, yo ponga la Fe.
Que allá donde hay desesperación, yo ponga la esperanza.
Que allá donde hay tinieblas, yo ponga la luz.
Que allá donde hay tristeza, yo ponga la alegría.*

*Oh Señor,
que yo no busque tanto ser consolado, cuanto consolar,
ser comprendido, cuanto comprender,
ser amado, cuanto amar.
Porque es dándose como se recibe,
es olvidándose de sí mismo como uno se encuentra a sí mismo,
es perdonando, como se es perdonado,
es muriendo como se resucita a la vida eterna.*

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AT THE CATHEDRAL

We are happy to say that we will offer Sacramental Preparation classes for children needing First Penance/First Holy Communion (grades 1-3) and Confirmation grades 7-8)! Litany of St. Joseph: A New Translation

On May 1, the Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments published additions to the official Litany of Saint Joseph. The additions were approved by Pope Francis and the Congregation deemed it appropriate to update the 112-year-old litany. Here are the seven new invocations:

- *Custos Redemptori* (Protector of the Redeemer)
- *Serve Christi* (Servant of Christ)
- *Minister salutis* (Minister of salvation)
- *Fulcimen in difficultatibus* (Support in difficulty)
- *Patrone exsulum* (Patron of refugees)
- *Patrone afflictorum* (Patron of the afflicted)
- *Patrone pauperum* (Patron of the poor).

The USCCB Committee on Divine Worship has approved a new version of the Litany of St. Joseph including official translations for the seven new invocations. The link to the newly translated Litany can be found below. This text may be freely reproduced and distributed.
