

Dear Parishioners.

Today is the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The miracles of Jesus always delight Christians. They manifest the wonder and providence of God who alone brings about the most extraordinary of things. Today, in the Gospel (John 6: 1-15) we arrive with Jesus at what first appears to be an impossible situation. There are thousands of hungry people before him with a boy in sight with only "five barley loaves and two fish." The multiplication of these loaves and fish by the Lord to feed the thousands gathered is only one part of the miracle. This miracle includes the revelation of who Jesus is. Like those who witnessed the miracle, we too must be in constant amazement at Jesus and proclaim him as Lord. We need to see in the miracle how it points to the greatest of Miracles, the Holy Eucharist, when Jesus feeds us with bread and wine that is truly his holy Body and Blood. This greatest of Miracles happens every Sunday, every day, for us. Much like the multiplication of the loaves and fish that provided much more than those gathered could eat, so with the Holy Eucharist it is more than we can grasp even with our lives of faith. The Eucharist, the action of Christ at the altar and the divine food that comes from it, calls for our praise and thanksgiving, our reverence and devotion, our desire to grow in understanding and faith.

Today is the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Grandparents play a very important role in our lives. In recognition of this, Pope Francis has established the fourth Sunday of July, the Sunday closest to the July 26 Memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of the Lord Jesus, as an observance of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. When the Holy Father announced this observance, he said, "Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith."

Let pray for grandparents, living and deceased, with the Collect for the Mass for Saints Joachim and Anne:

O Lord, God of our Fathers,
who bestowed on Saints Joachim and Anne this grace,
that of them should be born the Mother of your incarnate Son,
grant, through the prayers of both,
that we may attain the salvation
you have promised to your people.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Once again, please see elsewhere in this edition of the Parish Bulletin information on the preparation for the Sacraments—Confirmation, Penance and Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion—for school age children. Please do not delay in making contact with the Parish Office for enrollment in this preparation program.

TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: 2 Kings 4: 42-44

This text is the inspiration for the multiplication miracle. The gift of the man from Baal-shalishah indicates the esteem Elisha enjoyed among the people.

Reading II: Ephesians 4: 1-6

Paul points out that the new humanity created in Christ is exemplified by the Church's unity. This unity is fostered by humility, gentleness and patience.

The Gospel: John 6: 1-15

As in other of John's miracle stories, Jesus takes the initiative. He tests Philip, but the apostle misses the point that Jesus was appealing to his faith. Then Jesus distributes the bread and fishes, later avoiding any move on the people's part to make Him king.

REFLEXIÓN DEL RECTOR

Estimados feligreses,

¡Hoy es el décimo - séptimo domingo del tiempo ordinario! Los milagros de Jesús siempre deleitan a los cristianos. Manifiestan la maravilla y la providencia de Dios, quien es el único que produce las cosas más extraordinarias. Hoy, en el Evangelio (Juan 6: 1-15) llegamos con Jesús a lo que al principio parece ser una situación imposible. Hay miles de personas hambrientas ante él con un niño a la vista con solo "cinco panes de cebada y dos pescados". La multiplicación de estos panes y peces por parte del Señor para alimentar a los miles reunidos es solo una parte del milagro. Este milagro incluye la revelación de quién es Jesús. Como aquellos que presenciaron el milagro, nosotros también debemos estar en constante asombro por Jesús y proclamarlo como Señor. Necesitamos ver en el milagro cómo apunta al más grande de los milagros, la Sagrada Eucaristía, cuando Jesús nos alimenta con pan y vino que es verdaderamente su Santo Cuerpo y Sangre. Este milagro más grande sucede todos los domingos, todos los días, para nosotros. Al igual que la multiplicación de los panes y los peces que proporcionó mucho más de lo que los reunidos podían comer, con la Sagrada Eucaristía es más de lo que podemos captar incluso con nuestras vidas de fe. La Eucaristía, la acción de Cristo en el altar y el alimento divino que de él proviene, exige nuestra alabanza y acción de gracias, nuestra reverencia y devoción, nuestro deseo de crecer en comprensión y fe.

Hoy es el primer Día Mundial de los Abuelos y las Personas Mayores. Los abuelos juegan un papel muy importante en nuestras vidas. En reconocimiento a esto, el Papa Francisco ha establecido el cuarto domingo de julio, el domingo más cercano al Memorial del 26 de julio a los santos Joaquín y Ana, abuelos del Señor Jesús, como una observancia de la Jornada Mundial de los Abuelos y Ancianos. Cuando el Santo Padre anunció esta observancia, dijo: "No solo los nietos y los jóvenes están llamados a estar presentes en la vida de las personas mayores, sino que las personas mayores y los abuelos también tienen una misión de evangelización, anuncio y oración, y de animar jóvenes en su fe ".

Oremos por los abuelos, vivos y fallecidos, con la Colecta para la Misa de los Santos Joaquín y Ana:

Señor, Dios de nuestros padres,
Que concediste a los santos Joaquín y Ana la singular gracia,
De que naciera de ellos la Madre de tu Hijo encarnado,
concédenos, por las súplicas de ambos,
que alcancemos la salvación prometida a tu pueblo.
Por nuestro Señor Jesucristo, tu Hijo,
que vive y reina contigo en la unidad del Espíritu Santo,
y es Dios por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AT THE CATHEDRAL

We are happy to say that we will offer Sacramental Preparation classes for children needing First Penance/First Holy
