Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The Lord is rather strong in his language about sin in this Sunday's Gospel (see Mark 9: 38-43, 45, 47-48). We live in a time where sin—the choice not to love God and follow his saving Word—enjoys a comfort level among many Christians. In fact, many Christians do not see sin for what it really is. It is no different than the first sin, that is, the willful placing of ourselves above what God expects of us, loving him in return with a complete fidelity to his commandments. This is the way to peace in this life and eternal peace in the next. Sin not only separates us from God but also, as Jesus instructs, leads others away from God. It would be better for us to lose our life or parts of our body than lead someone into sin or sin ourselves. This begs a serious question for all of us. Do I have a hatred for sin? As at our baptism, every Easter we reject Satan and all his evil ways. Yet often we allow sin to creep into our lives and at times, it even goes unnoticed by us. With the clarity of the Lord's teaching in today's Gospel, let us examine our consciences with a sincere desire to turn away from all sin and be even more faithful to Jesus and all he commands of us. The practice of regular Confession is real antidote to any casualness with regard to sin for the Christian.

This coming Friday, October 1, 2021, begins the Month of the Holy Rosary. The Holy Rosary, with its mysteries and prayers, reminds us of the Gospel and the promises of our salvation. It also reminds us that our Blessed Mother Mary—with her vocation as the Mother of God and her life as a disciple of the Lord—are inseparable from the saving events of her Divine Son. As Christians, we pray the Holy Rosary for many different reasons. We have confidence that Our Lady will bring our many needs to her Son. We delight in the company of Our Lady as we pray. We join ourselves to the actions of Our Lady and her Only-Begotten Son for our salvation. Most of all, we are united with Our Lady in offering our daily lives with our Savior to the glory of our Father in heaven. I encourage you to pray the Rosary especially during this Month of the Holy Rosary. Perhaps consider inviting your spouse, your children or neighbors to join you.

Panhandlers are often attracted to gatherings at our Cathedral Basilica. I assure you that we have services available to assist the poor and homeless that frequent the Cathedral Basilica. Please do not give any money to the panhandlers inside or outside the Cathedral Basilica. If you are approached by a panhandler, please alert one of the parish priests or sacristans or greeters.

Next Sunday, the second collection will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL RECTOR

Estimados feligreses,

¡Hoy es el vigésimo sexto domingo del tiempo ordinario! El Señor es bastante fuerte en su lenguaje sobre el pecado en el evangelio de este domingo (ver Marcos 9: 38-43, 45, 47-48). Vivimos en una época en la que el pecado, la elección de no amar a Dios ni seguir su Palabra salvadora, goza de un nivel de consuelo entre muchos cristianos. De hecho, muchos cristianos no ven el pecado como lo que realmente es. No es diferente del primer pecado, es decir, ponernos voluntariamente por encima de lo que Dios espera de nosotros, amándolo a cambio con total fidelidad a sus mandamientos. Este es el camino hacia la paz en esta vida y la paz eterna en la próxima. El pecado no solo nos separa de Dios, sino que también, como instruye Jesús, aleja a otros de Dios. Sería mejor para nosotros perder nuestra vida o partes de nuestro cuerpo que llevar a alguien a pecar o pecar nosotros mismos. Esto plantea una pregunta seria para todos nosotros. ¿Tengo odio por el pecado? Como en nuestro bautismo, en cada Pascua rechazamos a Satanás y todos sus malos caminos. Sin embargo, a menudo permitimos que el pecado se infiltre en nuestras vidas y, a veces, incluso pasa desapercibido para nosotros. Con la claridad de la enseñanza del Señor en el evangelio de hoy, examinemos nuestra conciencia con un deseo sincero de apartarnos de todo pecado y ser aún más fieles a Jesús y a todo lo que nos manda. La práctica de la confesión regular es un verdadero antídoto contra cualquier casualidad con respecto al pecado para el cristiano.

El próximo viernes, 1º de octubre del 2021, comienza el Mes del Santo Rosario. El Santo Rosario, con sus misterios y oraciones, nos recuerda el Evangelio y las promesas de nuestra salvación. También nos recuerda que nuestra Santísima Madre María, con su vocación de Madre de Dios y su vida de discípula del Señor, son inseparables de los acontecimientos salvadores de su Hijo divino. Como cristianos, rezamos el Santo Rosario por muchas razones diferentes. Tenemos confianza en que Nuestra Señora traerá nuestras muchas necesidades a su Hijo. Nos deleitamos en la compañía de Nuestra Señora mientras rezamos. Nos unimos a las acciones de Nuestra Señora y su Hijo Unigénito para nuestra salvación. Sobre todo, estamos unidos a Nuestra Señora al ofrecer nuestra vida diaria con nuestro Salvador para la gloria de nuestro Padre celestial. Los animo a rezar el Rosario especialmente durante este Mes del Santo Rosario. Quizás considere invitar a su cónyuge, sus hijos o vecinos a que lo acompañen.

ST. JOHN'S HOSPICE



O'Neill, Pastor of Saint John the Evangelist Church, and The Little Brothers of The Good Shepherd, Saint Johns was created as an outreach ministry to serve and assist the poor and homeless in the community. Saint John's continues to provide crucial, life-sustaining services with dignity, respect and compassion to homeless men in Philadelphia. Saint John's Hospice is an independent 501c3 agency associated with the charitable work of Catholic Social Services.

Programs: Residence for over 250 homeless men each year in St. John's Hospice & Good Shepherd programs; Case management, medical and counseling for all residents and day service guests; Mail Room for over 900 homeless men; 160 showers with clean clothing, underwear & shoes every week; Over 3,000 meals each week to homeless & needy men; Emergency shelter for 27 homeless men where they can receive a meal & bed every night.
