Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus continues to teach us about being his followers in today's Holy Gospel (see Mark 10: 35-45). The Evangelist has been leading us to this point of the teaching of Jesus in a gradual way over the last several Sundays. The Lord has invited us to be comprehensive and complete in our discipleship. In following Jesus there is no room for serious sin, our way of life must be rooted in his plan for life, and keeping the Commandments must run deeply in our souls. Today, in the midst of the dispute among the disciples about who will sit on the right or left of him, Jesus seizes the occasion to bring his teaching on discipleship to a significant next step. To follow Christ is to follow him to the Cross. His true baptism is his offering of his life on the Cross for the glory of the Father and for our salvation. He desires that all who are redeemed and saved by his Cross likewise share in this type of "baptism." His Cross empowers us to also give our lives, every part of our lives, over to him for the glory of the Father and for the service of one another. Every time we participate in Mass, the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, we receive the grace to share in the Cross of Christ.

With the 6:30 PM Sunday Mass today, Archbishop Perez opens the Diocesan Phase of the next Synod of Bishops, which will take place in October 2023. This Synod of Bishops will have two preceding phases, the phase that takes place in each local diocese throughout the world (2021) which is then followed by a continental phase (2022). The theme for this Synod is *For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission*. These two phases anticipate and prepare for the international phase in Rome (2023) with the Synod of Bishops. The purpose of the Synod is to reflect on the need of every member of the Church to "walk together" with Jesus as the Head of his Body, the Church, in a way that deepens communion, calls forth greater participation in the life of Christ and his Church, and engages us in the mission of the Church with one another in the world. The work of each phase of the Synod is rooted in prayer and reflection. The very process itself fosters synodality, a "walking together" of the members of the Church for communion, participation and mission. More will be said about the Diocesan Phase in the Archdiocese over the next several weeks.

Next Sunday, October 24, 2021, we observe World Mission Sunday. Archbishop Perez will offer the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass next Sunday for the Archdiocesan observance of this occasion. World Mission Sunday reminds us to support the missions spiritually and materially. We are reminded also of our own duty as Christians to make Christ known in every possible circumstance. We will also assemble at this Mass with the Catholic Medical Association to ask the heavenly intercession of Saint Luke (October 18) for all those in the medical profession.

Next Sunday, the second collection will be directed to the Missions and Catholic Missionaries around the world. REFLEXIÓN DEL RECTOR

Estimados feligreses,

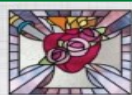
Hoy es el vigésimo noveno domingo del tiempo ordinario. En el Santo Evangelio de hoy Jesús continúa enseñándonos sobre ser sus seguidores (ver Marcos 10: 35-45). Durante los últimos domingos el evangelista nos ha estado conduciendo a este punto de la enseñanza de Jesús de manera gradual. El Señor nos ha invitado a ser comprensivos y completos en nuestro discipulado. Al seguir a Jesús no hay lugar para un pecado grave, nuestra forma de vida debe estar enraizada en su plan de vida, y guardar los Mandamientos debe estar profundamente en nuestras almas. Hoy, en medio de la disputa entre los discípulos sobre quién se sentará a su derecha o a su izquierda, Jesús aprovecha la ocasión para llevar su enseñanza sobre el discipulado a un próximo paso significativo. Seguir a Cristo es seguirlo a la cruz. Su verdadero bautismo es la ofrenda de su vida en la cruz para la gloria del Padre y para nuestra salvación. Él desea que todos los que son redimidos y salvados por su cruz también participen de este tipo de "bautismo". Su cruz nos da poder para entregar también nuestras vidas, cada parte de nuestras vidas, a Él para la gloria del Padre y para el servicio de los unos a los otros. Cada vez que participamos en la Misa, el Sacrificio de Cristo en la cruz, recibimos la gracia de compartir la cruz de Cristo.

Con la Misa dominical de hoy a las 6:30 PM, el Arzobispo Pérez abre la Fase Diocesana del próximo Sínodo de Obispos que tendrá lugar en octubre del 2023. Este Sínodo de Obispos tendrá dos fases precedentes, la fase que tiene lugar en cada diócesis local a lo largo del mundo (2021) a la que sigue una fase continental (2022). El tema de este Sínodo es *Para una Iglesia sinodal: Comunión, Participación, y Misión*. Estas dos fases anticipan y preparan la fase internacional en Roma (2023) con el Sínodo de los Obispos. El propósito del Sínodo es reflexionar sobre la necesidad de cada miembro de la Iglesia de "caminar juntos" con Jesús como Cabeza de su Cuerpo, la Iglesia, de una manera que profundiza la comunión, llama a una mayor participación en la vida de Cristo. y su Iglesia, y nos compromete en la misión de la Iglesia unos con otros en el mundo. El trabajo de cada fase del Sínodo tiene sus raíces en la oración y la reflexión. El mismo proceso fomenta la sinodalidad, un "caminar juntos" de los miembros de la Iglesia para la comunión, la participación y la misión. Se hablará más sobre la Fase Diocesana en la Arquidiócesis durante las próximas semanas.

El próximo domingo, 24 de octubre del 2021, observamos el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. El próximo domingo el Arzobispo Pérez ofrecerá la Misa Solemne de las 11:00 AM para la observancia arquidiocesana de esta ocasión. El Domingo Mundial de las Misiones nos recuerda que debemos apoyar las misiones espiritual y materialmente. También se nos recuerda nuestro propio deber como cristianos de dar a conocer a Cristo en todas las circunstancias posibles. También nos reuniremos en esta Misa con la Asociación Médica Católica para pedir la intercesión celestial de San Lucas (18 de octubre) por todos aquellos en la profesión médica.

El próximo domingo, la segunda colecta estará dirigida a las Misiones y Misioneros Católicos de todo el mundo. 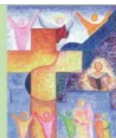
