

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, the liturgical time during the year. Although the period of Ordinary Time does not focus on a particular mystery of Christ, it gives us the opportunity to encounter Christ in all of his teachings and miracles. Today, in the Holy Gospel we hear about the miracle at the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. This familiar story of the Lord changing water into wine runs deep with theological meaning, especially following Christmas and Epiphany Time. This first of the signs of the Lord continues the Epiphany revelation of Jesus as the Savior and Redeemer. This miracle points to the change that will happen to all of creation and everyone made by the Lord with his death and resurrection. As we hear of this miracle today, it recalls the grace of Christmas and Epiphany that promises a change in all of us as followers of Christ. It also points to the change that should occur in each of us as we encounter our Savior and Redeemer in the Holy Eucharist. As we enter into this time during the year—for several weeks until Ash Wednesday—may we have the ears to hear each Sunday the invitation Christ gives us to be changed according to his plan for us and with his grace.

This Monday, January 17, 2022, we observe the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. This holiday has come to have a twofold focus. On the one hand, we recall the legacy of Dr. King as a champion of civil rights. On the other hand, we see the need to give expression to the equal dignity of each person by deeds of service that we can freely render to one another. Let us keep the holiday by living our own Christian mandate to respect one another regardless of race and our duty to be ready to help our neighbors in their need.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Tuesday, January 18, and continues until January 25. We join with Christians all throughout the world to pray that all who belong to Christ in Baptism may come to a deeper unity with one another in the Church. Please remember this intention in your personal prayers.

This Saturday, January 22, 2022, is the anniversary of the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in the United States. Since then, 60 million plus unborn children lost their lives to legalized abortion. This scar on the face of our nation continues to call Christians, everyone, into action in the defense of human life, from the first moment of conception until natural death. Respect for life is not the work of a few but the duty of all. The one thing that all of us can do is pray for the protection of human life.

Since 2011, Catholics in the United States, at the direction of the American Bishops, have observed January 22 as a day of prayer and penance. The intention of our prayer is for the full restoration and legal guarantee of the right to life. Our penance is for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. Decide today that you will pray for this intention this Saturday and what your personal sacrifice will be. Consider coming to the 12:05pm Mass in the Cathedral Chapel as part of your prayer for the day. The Holy Rosary will follow Mass for the intention for the protection of human life.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the young adult ministries in the Cathedral Parish. Existen documentos históricos que prueban que en el año de 1502, en la Isla de Santo Domingo, ya se daba culto a la Virgen Santísima bajo la advocación de Nuestra Señora de la Altagracia, cuyo cuadro pintado al óleo fue traído de España por los hermanos Alfonso y Antonio Trejo, que eran del grupo de los primeros pobladores europeos de la isla. Al mudarse estos hermanos a la ciudad de Higüey, RD llevaron consigo esta imagen y más tarde la ofrecieron a la parroquia para que todos pudieran venerarla.

En el 1572 se terminó el primer santuario altagraciano y en el 1971 se consagró la actual basílica, La Basílica de la Altagracia.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el segundo domingo del tiempo ordinario, el tiempo litúrgico del año. Aunque el período del tiempo ordinario no se centra en un misterio particular de Cristo, nos da la oportunidad de encontrar a Cristo en todas sus enseñanzas y milagros. En el santo evangelio de hoy, escuchamos acerca del milagro en las bodas de Caná de Galilea. Esta historia familiar del Señor que cambia el agua en vino tiene un profundo significado teológico, especialmente después de la Navidad y la Epifanía. Este primer signo del Señor continúa la revelación de la Epifanía de Jesús como Salvador y Redentor. Este milagro apunta al cambio que ocurrirá en toda la creación y en todos hechos por el Señor con su muerte y resurrección. Al oír hablar de este milagro hoy, recuerda la gracia de la Navidad y la Epifanía que promete un cambio en todos nosotros como seguidores de Cristo. También señala el cambio que debe ocurrir en cada uno de nosotros al encontrarnos con nuestro Salvador y Redentor en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Al entrar en este tiempo durante el año, durante varias semanas hasta el Miércoles de Ceniza, que tengamos los oídos para escuchar cada domingo la invitación que Cristo nos hace a ser cambiados de acuerdo con su plan para nosotros y con su gracia.

Este lunes, 17 de enero del 2022, observamos el Día de Martin Luther King, Jr. Esta fiesta ha llegado a tener un doble enfoque. Por un lado, recordamos el legado del Dr. King como defensor de los derechos civiles. Por otro lado, vemos la necesidad de dar expresión a la dignidad igualitaria de cada persona mediante obras de servicio que podemos prestar libremente los unos a los otros. Guardemos la festividad viviendo nuestro propio mandato cristiano de respetarnos unos a otros sin importar la raza y nuestro deber de estar listos para ayudar a nuestro prójimo en sus necesidades.

La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos comienza el martes 18 de enero y continúa hasta el 25 de enero. Nos unimos a los cristianos de todo el mundo para orar para que todos los que pertenecen a Cristo en el Bautismo puedan llegar a una unidad más profunda entre sí en la Iglesia. Por favor, recuerde esta intención en sus oraciones personales.

Este sábado 22 de enero del 2022 es el aniversario de la decisión de la Corte Suprema Roe v. Wade del 1973 que legalizó el aborto en los Estados Unidos. Desde entonces, por la legalización del aborto más de 60 millones de niños por nacer han perdido la vida. Esta cicatriz en el rostro de nuestra nación sigue llamando a los cristianos, a todos, a la acción en defensa de la vida humana, desde el primer momento de la concepción hasta la muerte natural. El respeto a la vida no es obra de unos pocos sino deber de todos. Lo único que todos podemos hacer es orar por la protección de la vida humana.

Desde el 2011, los católicos de los Estados Unidos, bajo la dirección de los obispos estadounidenses, han observado el 22 de enero como un día de oración y penitencia. La intención de nuestra oración es por el pleno restablecimiento y garantía jurídica del derecho a la vida. Nuestra penitencia es por las violaciones a la dignidad de la persona humana cometidas a través de actos de aborto. Decide hoy que orarás por esta intención este sábado y cuál será tu sacrificio personal. Considere asistir a la Misa de las 12:05pm en la Capilla de la Catedral como parte de su oración del día. El Santo Rosario seguirá a la Misa por la intención para la protección de la vida humana.

Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad a la Parroquia Catedral. La segunda colecta el próximo domingo estará dirigida al ministerio de jóvenes adultos en la Parroquia Catedral. Low-Gluten Hosts

For Catholics who have been diagnosed with Celiac Disease, or any similar gluten intolerance, we have the availability of low-gluten altar breads (hosts) that can be prepared for consecration.

These hosts, produced by the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in Clyde, Missouri, have been tested to contain less than .001% (10ppm) gluten. In this way, they are both approved for use at Holy Mass and are safe for almost all people who have a gluten intolerance. Additionally, both in storage and throughout the celebration of Mass, these hosts are kept separate, for the sake of those who have more extreme sensitivity to gluten. To request that a low-gluten host be prepared for you, please come to the sacristy before Mass and make this known to the priest and/or sacristan, who will offer further instructions.
