

This is the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Holy Gospel for this Sunday is a lesson in trust, trusting in God. The Lord asks Simon (Peter) to do the seemingly impossible by putting his nets out into the deep water to catch some fish where none were found through the previous night. Enough fish were caught that two boats were now in danger of sinking. Simon was distressed at his failure to trust the Lord. Jesus, however, tells Simon not to be afraid and that more will be asked of him. Trusting the Lord is not a once and only occasion for his followers. In fact, true disciples are those who follow the Lord constantly without fear that the one who leads will not fail to provide for them. Let us pray this day that we may always do what the Lords asks of us without fear and with a spontaneity of trust.

This Sunday, the annual Catholic Charities Appeal begins, Giving Hope to All 2022. The Catholic Charities benefits countless groups, organizations and agencies in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The appeal is conducted primarily through the mail but it is also possible to support the appeal through the Sunday Collection. Materials to do this will be in the pews for the month of February. This Friday, February 11, 2022, is the World Day of the Sick. The World Day of the Sick coincides with the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. Pope Saint John Paul II established this observance more than 25 years ago as a day to pray especially for the sick. Lourdes is a popular place of pilgrimage for the sick who turn to Our Blessed Mother for her prayers for healing and the help to unite their sufferings with those of her Son. This day reminds us of our duty to pray for the sick and to assist them in whatever ways are possible, especially by visiting the sick. Christ, as you know, has given to the Church a sacrament for the sick. This Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is especially for those who are seriously ill, facing surgery, and impeded by the difficulties associated with aging. Often times, as priests, we are called to administer this Sacrament when emergencies arise, especially in our neighboring hospitals. The Sacraments to receive at the end of life include Penance, the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Viaticum. Holy Viaticum is our last participation in Holy Communion as our passage is made from this life to eternal life. The Sacrament of the Sick, however, is for the sick even when there is no danger of death. I encourage you to receive this Sacrament if you are seriously ill or going to the hospital for surgery or if the senior years are a real struggle for you. To receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please notify the Parish Office or see one of the priests after Sunday Mass. This Sacrament can be received at any time and almost in any place. Christ wants to heal us and be our strength, especially with his Sacraments.

This Monday, February 7, 2022, the 2023 Parish Mass Book will open for couples to schedule their wedding at the Cathedral Basilica for 2023. On Monday, February 28, 2022, the Parish Mass Book will open to arrange for announced Masses for 2023.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the Care of Aging and Infirm Priests of the Archdiocese. 


A special pre-Lenten presentation featuring Paul E. Jarzembowski
