Dear Parishioners,

This is the Fourth Sunday of Lent! This Sunday also is referred to as *Laetare* Sunday, its Latin title. *Laetare* is the first word of the Introit (Entrance Chant) for this Sunday and means "rejoice". We rejoice this Sunday not because Lent has passed the half way mark but, more importantly, the joy of celebrating Easter is so much nearer. As we rejoice that soon our Lenten journey will come to an end with the great celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord, let us also resolve to keep even more vigilantly the discipline of Lent until Easter. The Holy Gospel for this Sunday, the return of the Prodigal Son to his Father, reminds all of us of our need to make a good Lenten Confession. If you have not taken the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation this Lent, plan now when that will take place over these next three weeks. Perhaps, you also might consider—if you are not doing so already--coming to Mass during the week, spending some time in adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, reading the Sacred Scriptures, making the Stations of the Cross, during these remaining weeks of Lent. *Yes, Easter is near. However, let us not coast through the valuable days of Lent that remain to prepare us for Easter.*

You are reminded that it is our Christian duty to provide for the Sacraments for those in danger of death, especially with the reception of the last Holy Communion, Holy Viaticum. In fact, it is a Precept of the Church to receive Holy Viaticum. Please call on the priests to minister to anyone who is seriously ill, especially nearing the end of life. It is best to make this contact with the parish priests while someone is still conscious and able to participate in the celebration of the Sacraments. During this month of March, the month of Saint Joseph, we recall he is the patron of a happy death. Let us pray to him that each of us will have the blessing of a sacramental death when the Lord calls us to our heavenly homeland.

This Tuesday, March 29, 2022, when our Parish Pastoral Council meets, they will discuss the concrete steps for the development of our Parish Pastoral Plan. Already, the Parish Pastoral Council has discerned the following three areas of significance for the Parish Pastoral Plan:

- 1. Hospitality**—ways to be more welcoming and inclusive of all parishioners and visitors to our Cathedral Basilica.
- 2. Information Sharing**—ways to get out the word about all that is happening at the Cathedral Basilica.
- 3. Communications and Parishioner Interaction**—ways to help parishioners to get to know one another and connect with one another outside of Sunday Mass.

The Parish Council will be looking for your input on these and other areas of the Parish Pastoral Plan. Stay tuned for more information.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

¡Este es el Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma! Este domingo también se conoce como Domingo *Laetare*, su título en latín. *Laetare* es la primera palabra del Introito (Canto de Entrada) de este domingo y significa “regocíjate”. Nos regocijamos este domingo no porque la cuaresma haya pasado la mitad del camino sino, más importante aún, porque la alegría de celebrar la Pascua está mucho más cerca. Mientras nos regocijamos de que pronto nuestro camino cuaresmal llegará a su fin con la gran celebración de la Resurrección del Señor, resolvámonos también a mantener aún más vigilantes la disciplina de la cuaresma hasta la Pascua. El santo evangelio de este domingo, el regreso del Hijo Pródigo a su Padre, nos recuerda a todos la necesidad de hacer una buena confesión de cuaresma. Si no ha aprovechado la oportunidad de celebrar el sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación esta cuaresma, planifique ahora cuándo tendrá lugar durante las próximas tres semanas. Tal vez, usted también podría considerar, si no lo está haciendo ya, venir a Misa durante la semana, dedicar algún tiempo a la adoración del Santísimo Sacramento, leer las sagradas escrituras, hacer las estaciones de la cruz, durante estas semanas restantes de cuaresma. *Sí, la Pascua está cerca. Sin embargo, no nos dejemos llevar por los valiosos días de cuaresma que nos quedan para prepararnos para la Pascua.*

Se les recuerda que es nuestro deber cristiano proporcionar los sacramentos a aquellos en peligro de muerte, especialmente con la recepción de la última Comunión, el Santo Viático. De hecho, es un precepto de la Iglesia recibir el santo viático. Pida a los sacerdotes que ayuden a cualquier persona que esté gravemente enferma, especialmente cuando se acerca al final de su vida. Es mejor hacer este contacto con los párrocos mientras alguien todavía está consciente y puede participar en la celebración de los sacramentos. Durante este mes de marzo, mes de San José, recordamos que es el patrón de una muerte feliz. Pidámosle que cada uno de nosotros tenga la bendición de una muerte sacramental cuando el Señor nos llame a nuestra patria celestial.

Este martes 29 de marzo del 2022, cuando se reúna nuestro Consejo Parroquial Pastoral, se discutirán los pasos concretos para el desarrollo de nuestro Plan Pastoral Parroquial. El Consejo Pastoral Parroquial ya ha discernido las siguientes tres áreas de importancia para el Plan Pastoral Parroquial:

- 1. Hospitalidad:** formas de ser más acogedores e inclusivos con todos los feligreses y visitantes de nuestra Catedral Basílica.
- 2. Intercambio de información:** maneras de correr la voz sobre todo lo que está sucediendo en la Catedral Basílica.
- 3. Comunicaciones e interacción con los feligreses:** formas de ayudar a los feligreses a conocerse y conectarse entre sí fuera de la misa dominical.

Synod 2023 - "For a Synodal Church"

Part 2: Participation

In honor of the 50th Anniversary of the establishment of the "Synod of Bishops" Pope Francis has asked the Church universally under the guidance of her Bishops to participate in a multi-year process of prayerful reflection and discernment to culminate in the next Synod of Bishops in 2023. This week we will consider the second theme of the 2023 Synod: "Participation."

In preparations for the Diocesan Phase of the Synod (happening now), the Secretary General of the Synod of Bishops published a helpful guide to assist local churches in their deliberations. There we find the following definition of "Participation". We read:

*"A call for the involvement of all who belong to the People of God – laity, consecrated and ordained – to engage in the exercise of deep and respectful listening to one another. This listening creates space for us to hear the Holy Spirit together, and guides our aspirations for the Church of the Third Millennium. Participation is based on the fact that all the faithful are qualified and are called to serve one another through the gifts they have each received from the Holy Spirit. In a synodal Church the whole community, in the free and rich diversity of its members, is called together to pray, listen, analyse, dialogue, discern and offer advice on making pastoral decisions which correspond as closely as possible to God's will (ICT, Syn., 67-68). Genuine efforts must be made to ensure the inclusion of those at the margins or who feel excluded."*²

"Participation" then is an effort to involve the widest number of persons and their particular voices in order to come to a clearer vision of the path God the Father is inviting us to walk together to himself. The focus on listening is especially important here. One definition of listening that may serve well here is the following: "Listening is the human means by which the vulnerable self-revelation of one's interior is received and loved."³ Listening is distinct from "being heard".

Much "dialogue" today involves more of an airing of grievances vs. a true sharing and coming to communion in truth. The Synod ought not to be seen or interpreted as the Catholic Church's attempt to imitate this sort of secular "dialogue". It is not the "reinvention" or "updating" of the Church to more adequately speak to "modern man" and his ever-changing priorities and moral outlook. Rather, the Synod seems to be an attempt to invite men and women of our day both far and near (those already of the flock of Jesus Christ and those who are not) into contact with our Savior and His Church, that together we may rediscover and live out of an appreciation for what God has done for his people. We can all use that! Next week we will consider the final pillar of the Synod's theme: "Mission."
