



Dear Parishioners,

*Today is the Second Sunday of Easter and also Divine Mercy Sunday. As Catholics, we continue to celebrate the great event of our Lord's Resurrection from the dead for this Sunday and every day until Pentecost Sunday, the conclusion of the fifty days of Easter Time. The Resurrection of our Lord is indeed an event that happened once in history but also happens now. The eternal Son of God went to the cross for us and so his death is eternal, present to everyone in every time. The same eternal Son of God was raised from the dead for us and so his resurrection is likewise eternal, present to everyone in every time. All that we hear about the Resurrection of Jesus in the Gospels, we hear with the ears of faith today, confident that the gifts given in history are given anew. Today, as the Gospel of John reveals, we receive the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of our sins. We follow the witness and example of Saint Thomas, believe Jesus is truly risen, and profess our faith in him. Our faith in the Resurrection needs to be firm and comprehensive. I encourage you to listen carefully these weeks of Easter Time to the prayers at Sunday Mass and the readings from Sacred Scripture to encourage and deepen a vivid faith in the Resurrection. *Christ is risen! He is truly risen, Alleluia!**

*Next Sunday, with May 1, 2022, we begin the Month of Mary. Mary, our Blessed Mother, is inseparable from the work of her divine Son. Our devotion to Mary leads to a greater love and fidelity to Jesus, his word and his way of life. Next Sunday, we will have the annual May Procession immediately following the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass. I encourage you to join us. Also, I encourage you to pray the Holy Rosary with greater frequency during this month and to pray the Easter prayer of our Lady, the *Regina Coeli*, as part of your own prayers. You are most welcome to bring flowers to any of the shrines of our Blessed Mother in the Cathedral Basilica during the month of May.*

Our celebration of the Sacred Paschal Triduum was a tremendous witness to our faith in the Risen Lord and a great service to our parishioners and so many visitors from all over the Archdiocese. I am so very grateful to all of our parish staff and liturgical ministers, employees and volunteers, who provided countless hours of preparation and service to help to celebrate Easter in such an extraordinary way this Easter Triduum.

*May and June are very important months for the success of our Parish Keys and Sword Event 2022. I invite our parishioners to ask among business associates and other institutions, especially restaurants, to consider an ad in our Ad Book. We depend on the success of the *Keys and Sword Event* to supplement many significance needs of the Cathedral Basilica. This scene is a type of epiphany given to John. It included a message. Jesus, having been exalted to divine status, gives the Apostle John a command to preach about what he has seen and heard.

The Gospel: John 20: 19-31

Jesus suddenly appears to the barricaded Apostles and sends them on mission. The once doubting Thomas makes a profound profession of faith, encapsulating the entire New Testament theme and purpose.

O'Neill, Pastor of Saint John the Evangelist Church, and The Little Brothers of The Good Shepherd, Saint Johns was created as an outreach ministry to serve and assist the poor and homeless in the community. Saint John's continues to provide crucial, life-sustaining services with dignity, respect and compassion to homeless men in Philadelphia. Saint John's Hospice is an independent 501c3 agency associated with the charitable work of Catholic Social Services.

Programs: Residence for over 250 homeless men each year in St. John's Hospice & Good Shepherd programs; Case management, medical and counseling for all residents and day service guests; Mail Room for over 900 homeless men; 160 showers with clean clothing, underwear & shoes every week; Over 3,000 meals each week to homeless & needy men; Emergency shelter for 27 homeless men where they can receive a meal & bed every night.
