Dear Parishioners,

Our celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus continues with this Third Sunday of Easter. In the Gospel today, the Risen Lord appears to his disciples, eats with them and engages Saint Peter in a profound conversation. The same Risen Lord is among us, appearing to us in countless ways - as we listen to his word, celebrate the Sacraments, in our prayer and in the Christian witness we experience from others, just to name a few of these ways. We need to be ready for these encounters with the Risen Lord to strengthen our faith in him and receive the grace to carry out the works of the Gospel. For us Christians, the Resurrection of Jesus is not just an awesome moment in salvation history rather it is an ongoing real experience for us now. Jesus Christ is risen, today!

Next Sunday, May 8, 2022, our 6:30 PM Mass will be celebrated according to the Ukrainian Catholic Rite (The Divine Liturgy) by Father Volodymyr Radko. Father Volodymyr was recently ordained in Ukraine and serves as Archbishop Borys Gudziak's Priest Secretary. Archbishop Borys is the Metropolitan Archbishop of Philadelphia of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. I extended this invitation to Father Volodymyr to allow us to give thanks for his priestly vocation and ordination as well to express our solidarity with Ukrainian people everywhere as we pray for peace in Ukraine. I hope that many will attend this Sunday Mass.

Monsignor D'Addezio is now settled in his new home, Villa Saint Joseph, Darby. He lives with nearly fifty other retired priests of the Archdiocese. He is happy in his new home.
