

Weekly Mass Intentions



Today is the Fifth Sunday of Easter! The Risen Lord manifests himself to us in a great number of ways. The most excellent manifestation of the Risen Lord takes place with the celebration of Mass, the Holy Eucharist. When the bread and wine, through the invocation of the Holy Spirit and with the Last Supper words of Christ spoken by the priest, become the Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, it is Easter - Christ on the cross and risen from the dead. When we come forward to receive Holy Communion, it is the Risen Lord that we receive, the glorified Lord, the Lord in history who is the Lord at the right hand of God, the Father, in heaven. This is truly the Risen Lord, indeed. Today, the holy Gospel speaks to us of another manifestation. Jesus says, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another (John 13: 35)." When Christians give themselves over to another person, as the Lord gave his life for us, as we love another as Christ loves us, it is also a manifestation of the Risen Lord among us. As we receive Holy Communion, let us pray that the grace of our Communion will help us to love one another, to reveal the resurrection among us.

This Saturday, May 21, 2022, Archbishop Pérez will ordain six men to the Holy Priesthood for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia in our Cathedral Basilica at 10:00 AM. All are welcome! This is a grand occasion for our local church. We rejoice in the vocations of these six men and pray the Lord, the great High Priest, will bless them with rich and fruitful priestly ministries. The month May sees our archdiocesan priests observing their anniversaries of Ordination and recalling the day when they were configured to Christ, the Eternal Priest. As we pray for the newly ordained, let us remember all our priests. May the Lord grant them many more years of priestly service to the People of God in this Archdiocese. As we all know, these have been difficult times for priests because of the serious transgressions of a few. The needed renewal of the Holy Priesthood is very much the work of every priest but not alone. The faithful rightly need to expect and encourage priests to be what Christ and his Church intends, shepherds after the Lord's own heart. So, during these days especially, let us pray for our priests, seminarians, especially our parish seminarians, and all those discerning this beautiful vocation. Our Lady, Queen of the Clergy, pray for us!

ABORTION IS THE GREATEST AND GRAVEST MORAL -PASTORAL ISSUE FACING THE UNIVERSAL CHURCH


