Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Sixth Sunday of Easter! The prayers and readings of the Sacred Liturgy are preparing us to receive anew the great gift of the Risen Lord and his heavenly Father, the Holy Spirit of Pentecost. In the holy Gospel for this Sunday we read, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you (John 14: 26)." On our part, we need to turn to God, the Holy Spirit, in our thoughts and prayers, asking his aid to know more profoundly the word of Jesus and the will of his Father. It is the Holy Spirit who unites us to the Risen Lord and to one another in the Church. It is the Holy Spirit who keeps us faithful to the Gospel and impels us to live it out in our Christian lives. It is the Holy Spirit who protects us from sin and prompts us to constant service of one another. As we prepare for Pentecost and a new outpouring of God, the Holy Spirit, upon all of us, let us not neglect to pray over these next weeks, Come, Holy Spirit!

This Thursday, May 26, 2022 is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, a Holy Day of Obligation. The Holy Day of the Ascension, like all the Holy Days of Obligation, requires Catholics to participate in the celebration of Mass and - as much as possible - to observe the day in a Sunday like manner. This is often difficult for many. However, carelessly to pass over this obligation is a grave sin. Please see the schedule for Masses for the Holy Day elsewhere in this edition of the Parish Bulletin. The Ascension reminds us, that with the Resurrection of the Lord, we too have the promise of one day joining our Lord in glory at the right hand of our heavenly Father and that we can live now as if we are already dwelling with Christ in heaven.

The Annual Catholic Charities Appeal is well underway throughout the Archdiocese. Most of you have received information about this Appeal through the mail and electronically. Thousands of people throughout the region are assisted in remarkable ways that would not be possible without the funds raised by the Catholic Charities Appeal. Our Cathedral Parish goal of \$49,000 dollars toward the overall goal of the Appeal has only reached the halfway point as of today. 

Dear Clergy,

Religious, and Lay Faithful of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia,

This year's celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, on June 19, 2022, also marks the inauguration of a three-year National Eucharistic Revival called for by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The goal of the Eucharistic Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

The first year of the Eucharistic Revival, which begins on June 19, 2022, is the Diocesan Phase. Various diocesan-level events will be offered in which we hope you will participate and invite your communities to do the same. An introductory webinar will be held for clergy and parish leaders of the Archdiocese on May 25, 2022 from 10-11 am to assist parishes in using the Diocesan Phase to begin planning for the Parish Phase the following year. Additionally, several resources are being developed and will be made available to clergy and parish leaders to assist them in the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, catechesis, devotion, and mission. These materials and the link to register for the webinar are available on the Archdiocesan website, phillyeucharisticrevival.org.

The second year of the Eucharistic Revival, which begins on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord in June of 2023, is the Parish Phase. During this year, parishes, institutions, and religious communities are asked to devote their attention to:

- (1) a renewed excellence in the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy,
- (2) intentional catechesis of all the faithful on the Church's teachings on the Eucharist,
- (3) cultivation of a deeper appreciation for the Church's Eucharistic devotion (e.g., processions, Eucharistic Adoration, and Forty Hour Devotions), and
- (4) the important connection between the Eucharist and mission. Also, an Archdiocesan Eucharistic Congress will be held on Saturday, September 30, 2023, at the Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown.

We look forward to sending a delegation to the National Eucharistic Congress, which will be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, from July 17-24, 2024. This national gathering of the faithful will begin the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, which is the Year of Going Out on Mission.

Please join me in praying that the National Eucharistic Revival will bear good fruit in our spiritual lives as we focus more intentionally on our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.
